Doubt No Longer, But Believe

For the Gospel of John, it is on the Cross that God's saving love for us can be seen. Because this is true, this Gospel uses the stories around the resurrection of Jesus in a different way. The storyteller is not so concerned with what happened to Jesus as with what happened, and continues to happen, to those who believe in Jesus.

At the heart of today's Gospel reading lies the thought that the resurrection of Jesus does not guarantee true faith. We read of two encounters with the Risen Lord. In the first of them, significantly set on "the first day of the week," a Sunday, the day on which the resurrection is recalled, Jesus appears among his disciples. They are full of fear, but Jesus comes to bring them peace. This appearance brings joy, but it also brings responsibility. The disciple is not only asked to bask in the joy of knowing that the Lord has risen. The disciple is to continue the mission of Jesus. Just as Jesus was sent by the Father, so now the disciple is sent by Jesus. Just as Jesus brought forgiveness and peace to those to whom he was sent, so also is the disciple, full of the gift of the guiding, strengthening and teaching Holy Spirit, to forgive and to retain sins.

But the resurrection of Jesus does not always bring joy and peace. The story of Thomas has been told to make that clear. When Jesus comes to his frightened first disciples, locked in the upper room, to bring joy, peace, and a commission, the Gospel writer tells us: "Thomas was not with them when Jesus came. "One of the disciples has not had the experience of the Risen Lord. He is elsewhere.

Thomas does not refuse the proclamation of the resurrection of Jesus when his friends tell him. This is the meaning of the twice repeated word on the lips of Thomas: "unless!" He will only believe if the risen Jesus fulfills his conditions.

The following Sunday Thomas is challenged by Jesus himself to come to the true peace which only authentic faith can produce. He is forced to see the pointlessness of his demands. When he is invited to test his own conditions, he sees the stupidity of his ways, imposing conditions on God. At last, he understands that he cannot tell God how things must be.

But the Gospel was not written simply to tell us about the story of Thomas. It was written to lead us more deeply into our commitment to Jesus as Lord and God. We have not seen all that Thomas and the other disciples saw, yet we believe. But maybe this is not enough. The Gospel writer asks us to recognise the level of our faith. Like Thomas, are we sometimes "not there" when Jesus comes, or, again like Thomas, do we want God to behave in the way that might suit us best? The Gospel asks that we go further. The story of Jesus was written for us so that we might deepen our belief that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God.

Such belief is life-giving!


Responsorial Psalm 117


