"IN FLANDERS FIELDS"

Anzac Day 2021

Each year on the 25th of April we commemorate the sacrifice made by so many soldiers who fought and died in the wars of the twentieth century. One way in which we show our respect and gratitude is to buy a symbolic red poppy. This practice arose because of the popularity of a poem written by a Canadian doctor, John McCrae, during the first world war. McCrae wrote the poem in May 1915 while he was taking care of hundreds of soldiers who were victims of gas attacks.

The poem is called "In Flanders Fields".

In Flanders fields the poppies blow Between the crosses row on row. That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard among the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow.
Loved and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.
