13 June 2021, 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the gospel reading this Sunday, Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to the mustard seed, a tiny seed that grows into a great tree. It is just like this with the sacred music we sing at mass. They were originally tiny seeds – simple intonations of psalms and bible readings, like the Latin psalms we still chant today at 11am mass at St Mary of the Angels. As centuries passed and liturgy developed, so did the sacred music attached. Even by around 1000 AD, when most of the chants we use at 11am mass had been written down in musical notation, the seeds of the music are still present.

You can still hear those simple intonations in the music of the Introits, which call us to worship and prepare our spirits for the liturgy. Sometimes you can still hear them leading into the extroverted melismas of the Alleluia chants, the fanfares that herald the gospel readings. They are also embedded in the communion chants, meditations that accompany the Eucharist. The way these chants were sung and composed grew and transformed through more centuries of divine inspiration to the beautiful polyphonic flowerings of Palestrina and Victoria in the 16th Century, and they continue to grow today.

Just as the seed of witnessing the word of God in song led to a forest

of sacred music, so did the desire to sing to the glory of God together in our own words lead to hymns. The 6th Century hymn for Good Friday, "Crux fidelis", describes another tree – the one became the cross that bore Christ. It too grew from a tiny seed and become a great tree that shelters many in its shade!

"Faithful Cross, among all others one noble tree. No forest offers so great a flower, a leaf, a seed. Sweet wood, it holds sweet nails, and a precious load."
