Faith as Power

Most of us think of "faith" as trust in other people. We take it on faith, for example, that mechanics adequately fix the breaks on our cars, that supermarkets are not selling us contaminated food, and that doctors provide competent diagnoses of our illnesses. We might also think of faith in terms of specific beliefs we have as Christians. For instance, we believe that God exists, that Jesus is the Son of God, and that the Bible is inspired by God. We get a different slant, however, on the nature of faith in today's Gospel reading from Mark. A woman touches Jesus' robe as he walks by and is immediately cured of a long-term illness. Jesus felt that "power" had gone out of him and said to her: "Daughter, your faith has made you well." Further on in this reading, Jesus consoles a synagogue official who has just been informed that his daughter had died, and tells him: "Do not fear, only believe." Moments later, the official's daughter is brought back to life. The interpretation of "faith" we read here is that it is a power that makes miracles happen.

When understood as a power, faith becomes an instrument of effective and successful living. Faith makes things happen. It is an energy that makes what we believe come true. When we believe in other people, for instance, we draw out the best in them. Believing in a son or daughter, and letting them know we

believe in them, has more power for drawing out their goodness and potential than all the lecturing in the world. Students can be "believed" into greater academic achievement by a teacher who expresses belief, or confidence, in them, just as doctors can use faith to bring about healing in their patients. When we believe in ourselves, we actually empower ourselves to achieve our objectives. Jesus tells us that faith the size of a grain of sand can move mountains. FAITH **WORKS!**


