## **Sharing Makes Life Go Around**

In the long history of human evolution, humankind has learned many significant lessons that have enabled it to survive and prosper. One of the most important is cooperation and working for the common good. Where people live in enmity and where competition gets out of hand, everyone suffers. Where people are mutually supportive, however, and learn to share, everyone benefits. This is a fundamental rule of any thriving family, community, or society. In today's Gospel, Jesus performed a miracle of multiplying a few loaves and fishes and thousands were fed. It must have been impressive for the disciples to see bread and fish multiplying before their very eyes. But did it actually happen like that? Did fish and loaves really multiply in baskets? Is the "miracle" the point of this gospel passage? Perhaps. It is also likely we are getting a lesson in the

Work is always easy when enough workers share the labour. A labour of love most often doesn't feel like labour at all. To receive a helping hand when we need it most can make our day. When sharing, rather than greed, is the rule, people prosper. In our contemporary society, though, real sharing is often done grudgingly and competitiveness has become a mania. Business talks flippantly about a "dog eat dog world," and "It's a jungle out there" is routinely accepted as the way things are. We are very property-conscious in our consumer culture and are extremely sensitive and protective about what we consider ours. Burglary prevention systems have become a billion-dollar-a-year industry.

And with what results? Does society generally improve with rugged individualism and aggressive competition? Do we feel more secure with all our possessions? Do we actually sleep easily knowing the car has an alarm system? Are we more at ease walking the streets at night, knowing the police force has been beefed up with better communications? Have we ever felt safe from enemies abroad, knowing that our weapons were superior?

One of the great ironies in life is that stingy people never seem to have enough and that generous people never run out of things to share or give away. In affluent communities, there are overstocked pantries and children complain: "There's nothing to eat." But in the homes of the poor, there is often enough to go around, even for unexpected company. Attitude is all-important here. In the Gospel reading, Jesus gives us an example of the miracle of sharing. Can we not suspect that it was Jesus' willingness to share his few loaves and fishes that encouraged others to do the same? Everyone sharing the loaves and fishes that eventually allowed everyone to get something to eat - that's the miracle!


