8 August 2021, 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today in New Zealand we celebrate the Feast of St Mary Mackillop. In Australia they celebrate the Solemnity. Mary MacKillop was born 1842 in Melbourne. Baptised at St Francis' Church Melbourne by a pioneer priest Patrick Geoghegan. Together with Fr. Julian Tennison Woods, Mary established a religious community dedicated to the education of children in remote places. After 10 years she came to N.Z and founded a school in Temuka, and several primary and secondary schools throughout the country.

The congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart grew rapidly and incurred the suspicion, if not the wrath of some Bishops. This led to Mary's excommunication for a time. Her goodness and determination and dependence on God's providence helped her through many difficult times so as she approached the end of her life, she had the joy of seeing her vision grow to maturity. She died in Sydney on 8th August 1908.

Todays Readings especially the Gospel speaks to us of the importance of the Eucharist in our lives. Like Mary Mackillop and many other Founders of Congregations the Eucharist would have been a very important part of her life and the life of her Sisters.

Christ wants to be united with us in an unique way, in a most intimate way possible. There is saying, 'You are what you eat.' Jesus wants to be part of our lives, regardless who we are. Bread was the stable food in His time and culture. When Jesus speaks of Himself as the Bread of Life we should eat. He wants to become the stable food for our spiritual life. Stable food is not eaten once a year, or once a month or week. It is eaten daily.

Unfortunately this can lead to a routine. We are challenged today to be more conscious of the Real Presence' of Christ when we line up to receive Holy Communion. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: 'the mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the other sacraments as the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all sacraments tend. In this blessed sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore the whole Christ, is truly, really, and substantially contained". (CCC1374)

An important point when we approach the Eucharist, the Church Fathers taught: while ordinary food is assimilated into man, the opposite takes place in Holy Communion. Man is assimilated into the Bread of Life. This profound truth of Christ's total self-giving can help to overcome the tendency of just "going to Communion" when all others in the church also line up. Be prepared and approach Christ with reverence.

On Sunday, the 15th of August, the Rededication of Aotearoa New Zealand to Mary, Mother of God, Issumed into Heaven will be held at St Mary of the Angels Church. All our Bishops and the Apostolic Nuncio will join together at St Mary of the Angels to relebrate this unique event. The ceremony will start at 1.30pm with a blessing of the image of Mary, especially commissioned for the rededication, followed by a mass. The image will then go on a Hikoi around Aotearoa New Zealand for at least some months risiting all the dioceses before returning permanently to St Mary of the Angels, the newly designated National Shrine.
