

22 August 2021, 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

"This is the great Mystery, it applies to Christ and the Church"

On the 1 August 2021, I, along with my fellow community from St Joseph's Mt Victoria, became a parishioner of St Mary of the Angels Parish. In this context I was surprised but honoured to be invited to write a reflection for the cover of the Angelus this weekend.

As I discerned this week's readings, I realised my diplomatic skills would be truly tested as I spotted one of the New Testament verses from St Paul to the Ephesians 5:22-24, that I struggle to be at peace with.

I took a step back, and prayed to Mary asking for the eloquence of our Marists who have the wisdom to see the potential in every life experience even the difficult ones. And in so doing I accepted the historical context of these writings, and the words "two becoming one body" from St Paul to Ephesians struck me as totally relevant today.

We are living in tumultuous times through our World; with a Pandemic that is ongoing as the virus continues to mutate, and Level 4 Lockdown has become a reality; with an imbalance of wealth between nations, a time when wars and civil unrest are prevalent, and the implications of climate change are evident.

That is why the celebration of Te Ara a Maria, at St Mary of the Angel's last Sunday 15 August 2021 was uplifting and so important in the history of Aotearoa/New Zealand.

Cardinal John in his homily said that the bishops chose to celebrate the rededication of New Zealand to Mary Assumed into Heaven, at St Mary of the Angels, at a time when there is great need for protection and connection to Mary, as we ask for comfort and care for ourselves and for all New Zealanders in these troubled times. The work of art by Christchurch based artist Damien Walker, of a Madonna and child has an emphasis on unity. This artwork which will visually connect the people with Mary and Jesus, will be on display while on hikoi around the country from the deep south to the far north, then will return to reside at St Mary of the Angels.

So much has happened in the last month. St Joseph's has become part of St Mary of the Angel's Parish and Wellington Central Parish has changed forever. We have welcomed new life and the spring flowers have burst into bloom, and we have farewelled our dead, in ways which celebrate our belief in eternal life. A week after a national celebration for Te Ara a Maria was held in our Parish, we are living once again in the physical isolation of our small bubbles, at the same time our faith provides a platform to link us spiritually and socially through prayer and word as "one body."

As we take time out and slow down in response to Level 4 Lockdown, we may conceptually see Mary and Joseph on the edge of change ready to journey together through the many challenges that we face on our way. We are at the stage of wanting to know more about our diverse communities, to broaden our understandings of what we bring to the "Table", of how we live the "Word."

Together we can do so much more, as the faith communities of St Mary of the Angels and St Joseph's as we grow together as one Parish. We will be able to reach out and support those whose load is heavy and are weary. Together we can create a sanctuary of hope and aroha for the city of Wellington. Together we can be the "Body of Christ."




