They surrounded me, the snares of death, with the anguish of the tomb; they caught me, sorrow and distress. I called the Lord's name.



A Culture of Encounter

Exploring the themes of "Fratelli Tutti"

Called to be God's hands and feet.

Pope Francis warns us that the sense of belonging to a single human family is failing as the world continues to grapple with Covid 19, we must not dismiss the sense that we all have a common humanity.

Do we allow fears and uncertainties to condition our way of thinking? Encouraging us to be intolerant of others, not open to relating to others who are different to us, and putting up barriers, adopting "isms" such as racism, as a way of behaviour. These barriers get in the way of our encounters with others.

To develop a culture of encounter we have to first accept that we have put up these walls and then consciously work on breaking these walls down. Fraternal love means we care for everyone, no matter their age, religion, culture, or any kind of classification we give to 'others" there are no divisions if someone is suffering we become the Good Samaritan. The world will be a better place if we all care for the common family, and for the natural resources that support our common family and don't compete for resources that are scarce in developing countries.

There are many ways we can promote and live a culture of encounter. Pope Francis is asking us to consider the themes of "Fratelli Tutti."

Caritas New Zealand has some excellent resources for families to use with their children, their parents may want to search "Fratelli Tutti' and explore Pope Francis's writings over the next week.
