### 26 September 2021, 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Like myself I am sure there are many who are very disappointed that we are still in lockdown 2 as regards Masses for the next couple of weeks. Times are certainly different from what many of us expected. We are now entering a very different world.

You may recall that last week we read from Mark's Gospel how Jesus chastised his disciples for arguing as to who was the greatest .In today's Gospel John questions Jesus about an unknown exorcist who was driving out demos in Jesus' name. John's question may have been motivated by jealousy. Previously in Mark's Gospel Jesus healed a boy whom the disciples have not been able to heal. John's question is further evidence that the disciples have not yet grasped Jesus' word to them. They continue to compare themselves to others who seem to have greater healing powers, and they do not want to share the power of Jesus' name with others.

The demon possession described in the Gospels might be seen as a form of mental illness but the need for healing these syndromes was as real then as it is today.

The disciples observed that the unknown exorcist invoked Jesus' name and was successful in his healing efforts. This unknown healer recognised the power of Jesus' name, yet he was not a follower of Jesus. In his reply to his disciples, Jesus acknowledges that deeds of faith can precede the words of faith. He also teaches that the disciples should not be reluctant to share Jesus' healing powers with

Later in this Gospel, Jesus teaches us not to create obstacles for those who are just beginning to have faith but to encourage even the smallest signs of faith. The Greek word used here for sin also connotes "stumbling" or "causing scandal". In vivid terms Jesus teaches his disciples the consequences to those who would put obstacles before people who are on the road to faith.

Pope Francis made headlines when he humbly said, "Who am I to Judge?" Every time he embraces a sick or deformed person he becomes newsworthy. He has done away with a lot of pomp, lives in a simple room, joins Vatican employees for breakfast, and even lines up for it with a tray on hand. If a Pope can do it, why can't I?


