31 October 2021, 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

A magazine I came across reported how the director of a funeral parlour asked his clients." If you are allowed to bring along a small suitcase when you die, what would you put into it?" All kind of answers came up, Wedding ring, trophy, photos of the family, a few odds and ends. When asked the funeral director he answered, Surely the most precious thing in life. Which what would that be? The scribe wanted to know exactly that: Which is the first of all the commandments?" Which thing matters most?

The wisest teacher and counsellor, Jesus, gives an answer that is clear, precise and firm. "First love God, with all your heart, soul, mind and strength; second, love your neighbour as yourself. Nothing is greater than these." The scribe feels that Jesus has articulated what is deepest in his own heart. "You are right. Approved." Would I also agree wholeheartedly with Jesus?

Jesus was not the only Jewish teacher to connect these two commandments, love of God and love of neighbour. Both of these commandments were central elements of the religious tradition that Jesus learned from his Jewish community. These commandments continue to be central aspects of contemporary Jewish understanding. Jesus response to his questioners proposed and integral connection between these two aspects of the Jewish law. Love of God finds expression in our love for our neighbour. Many believe, however, that this connection was heard in a new and fresh way when spoken by Jesus.

The scribe who questions Jesus in today's Gospel engages in a positive dialogue with Jesus. He agrees with Jesus teaching that the commandments to love God and neighbour stand above the commandment to offer worship and sacrifice in the temple. With this dialogue Jesus appears to close the debate with the Jewish authorities. St. Mark reports that no one dared to question Jesus further.

Indeed the scribe gets his priorities right. For him, the top priority, the guiding principle and ideal in life, is loving God with all his heart and loving his neighbour as himself. When we practice that, the reign of God is becoming a reality in our world today. There is no greater commandment than these.

Finally this is our way we find amid so many duties to God and neighbour." if you are obliged to go to prayer when your neighbour asks for herb tea, first give him the herb tea'!

Just remember, you never see a hearse with a trailer! Or a shroud with a pocket!!
