# 5 December 2021, 2nd Sunday of Advent

At the heart of the season of Advent, is the reality of waiting. The Israelites spent a long time waiting for the Messiah and the Kingdom of God to arrive. In the words of Psalm 44 the people cry out to the Lord:

Wake up, O Lord! Why are You sleeping? Arise! Do not reject us forever. Why do You hide Your face and forget our affliction and oppression?

When we are suffering time seems to move slowly. Anyone who has spent time in a hospital emergency room knows this well. But waiting itself can be a sort of suffering; we deny ourselves gratification in the present for the hope of something better in the future. Good waiting is sacrificial. This is why waiting always implies a waiting for. This is true whether I am waiting for a bus, waiting for a friend to text me back, waiting for a visit from my daughter, or waiting for God to enter more deeply into my life.

There are two approaches to waiting. The first is directionless and meaningless waiting. C.S. Lewis said that sometimes serious grief robs the future of any positive hope or joy.

[G]rief ... feels like fear. Perhaps, more strictly, like suspense. Or like waiting; just hanging about waiting for something to happen. It gives life a permanently provisional feeling. It doesn't seem worth starting anything. I can't settle down. I yawn, I fidget, I smoke too much. Up till this I always had too little time. Now there is nothing but time. Almost pure time, empty successiveness.

Lewis could be speaking about our COVID situation. It is frustrating when the sacrifice of our waiting is robbed of any hope of return. Perhaps unknowingly, C.S. Lewis almost perfectly describes the vice of acedia or spiritual tiredness. John Cassian says that someone afflicted with acedia either sinks into slumber in his room, becoming sluggish when it comes to work, or [paradoxically] becomes restless and a wanderer, trying to find consolation through visiting other people.

All of this sounds familiar to me.

As people of faith, our waiting should take on a sense of trust and hope. The 'wilderness' of the present should be' saturated with the hope of the future. This second sort of 'faith-waiting' is modelled by St. John the Baptist. St John does not run from the wilderness of the present, but trusting in God's love proclaims the coming of Christ from the heart of the desert: ... all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

Let us not despair at the suffering of waiting, but see our waiting as a faithcharged sacrifice. God does not break his promises.
