A Matter of Balance

A heavily pregnant woman on a donkey. Personal belongings uncomfortably strapped in front and behind. Travelling long distances for several days. In the heat with choking dust constantly swirling around. Rough roads and stony tracks. From time to time being jostled and pressed by other pilgrims passing by. This was Mary on her way to Bethlehem.

Not at all an easy ride! At the very least she would have needed a great sense of balance, of poise. No matter how gentle the pace it would have been a trying journey.

Mary's sense of balance would not only have been something physical. There was a spiritual balance she needed as well. To find that fine point of balance as she swayed between deepening feelings of awe and wonder as the birth of this unexpected child drew nearer and lingering feelings of apprehension and anxiety at 'what it could all mean'. And then there was the balance to be discovered between her expectations and those of Joseph, her husband, who was so much part of her motherhood yet somehow not. And had she, even at this late hour, found the balance between her will and God's will for her?

As always, Mary, the first and greatest of Christ's disciples, has so much to teach us about what it means to undertake the journey of Faith. We, too, have to find and maintain that fine point of balance as we make our way through life. No matter where we are on our journey - whether we are still exhilarated by morning freshness, burdened by the noonday heat, or worn out as the shadows lengthen - we need to keep searching for that point of balance: seeking to adjust ever so subtly as slight discomforts increase; accepting the need to take the time to rearrange ourselves, when it all becomes too much, and then move on again. Never denying the ever-changing reality we are experiencing but always keeping in mind the goal of journey that makes it all worthwhile.

And that goal is to give flesh to the Word, as Mary did. To bring the Word of Life into the world through all that we do or say, for richer or poorer, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health.

My prayer for us all this Christmas is that, amidst all the disjointedness and strangeness of these times we are journeying through, we will find the fine point of balance and so arrive at Bethlehem where the peace and joy only the Christchild can bring awaits us.

- Communion under one kind only, therefore no Precious Blood is to be distributed
- No physical contact at the Sign of Peace
- Communion on the hand only

Registration for Christmas Liturgies that do not require a Vaccine Pass will open 3 days prior to each Mass. Please email office.manager@smoa.org.nz



NZCBC Secretary Bishop Steve Lowe says the original timeframe was difficult for Southern Hemisphere countries because of our summer holiday period, with the Covid-19 restrictions making face-to-face contact hard.
