"Preach the Gospel at all times. Use words if necessary."

This is one of the more famous quotes attributed to St. Francis of Assisi. The quote intimates that our witness to the Gospel is more effective when our behaviour is congruent with what we believe. We probably know Christians who are loud about the doctrines and morals of the Church but are far from living them themselves. So far so good.

The only trouble with this quote is that it subtly sets up a dichotomy between preaching the Gospel with words and our moral behaviour. It may lead us to believe that only those who are already perfect have 'earned' the right to witness to the Gospel. Or even worse, to believe that our faith can be reduced to good behaviour. After some digging (and with some relief), I discovered that St. Francis never said this.

If we consider Jesus Christ's calling of the Apostles and disciples, we see that he doesn't select perfect men and women. Before meeting Christ, those who will come preach the Gospel are often not known for their good behaviour. Peter is aware of his unworthiness to be sent on mission and falls at the feet of Christ: Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man. 'Christ reassures Peter, that despite his sinfulness he shouldn't be afraid to be a 'fisher of men'.

This accords with the Prophet Isaiah's felt unworthiness to be a messenger for the Lord: 'I am a man of unclean lips,' he cries. The Lord reaches down and purifies his lips with a live coal, both acknowledging Isaiah's sinfulness and rendering him worthy to preach.

For Peter, Isaiah, and us too, it is God who purifies and sends out to preach. In this line, St. Paul in his Letter to the Corinthians outlines our role as preachers of the Gospel.

I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

While it is good to be conscious of our own sinfulness, this shouldn't stop us from preaching the Gospel. The truth of the Gospel, despite our personal failures, still has power to save.

One of the silver linings of the Covid Pandemic is that discussions of a deeper nature often arise in work and family situations. These may be opportunities to share our hope in eternal life through the death and resurrection of Christ.




