The Beatitudes

There is no human being in the world who does not want to be happy. There is only a difference of opinion about what happiness is and how to attain it. Happiness implies that certain desires are being satisfied; and since our desires are never fully satisfied, a happy person trusts, has hope, for more to come. Happiness is beautiful, but it always prompts the question; what about tomorrow?

There are people who want instance happiness. "I am only young once; lets live it up!" Others search for happiness in an affluent life. What about getting old and facing the end? Many want happiness even if necessary at the cost of destroying the well-being of others.

We should see the Beatitudes in today's reading as a challenge to perfection directed to all who seriously search for happiness. "Blest are the poor....Woe to the rich." It is true that the poor feel the insufficiency of the human condition, hence the felt need for God, more so than the rich.

Jesus himself is the message of happiness. The blessed of the kingdom starts today, it is both present and is to come. It reaches us already in the person of Jesus Christ, in the poor, the persecuted. He took to himself the cause of all unhappy ones of this world. In the midst of sufferings and privations the followers of Christ can rejoice and be happy.

We live in a world today which is divided not only between rich and poor nations, but where divisions are found between every nation and society. Today's poor are happy not because the prospect of coming wealthy, but because the kingdom of Heaven is promised to them, their hope is in the Lord.

More than ever today, the Church must welcome to itself people from every continent and island, the crowds of the poor. She must remain open to all in need; she offers them union with Christ, provided they offer themselves to God and accept His ways and values.

Lenten Reflection Group


