27 February 2022, 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's gospel reading concludes Luke's account of Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, which we have been hearing over the past two Sundays. This is similar to the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew. As a man on a mission - to reveal God to us - Jesus would have repeated the same message to the different crowds who gathered around him in various places. He wants us to see God's intention and desire for our lives.

The blessings and the woes in the first part of the sermon, show Jesus' care for all as he calls the rich to practice justice and the poor to have hope. In the second part last Sunday, we heard how we should strive to love as God loves - "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you". This seems too hard because we are human, but we know that God is merciful and forgiving of our human failure. Jesus tells us, and it is comforting to know, that being merciful and forgiving ourselves is a good place to start.

The sermon concludes this week with Jesus' caution about criticizing the faults of those around us, without being aware of or while denying our own. The protest at parliament over the past two weeks has highlighted that the meaning of 'the log in our eye' can be broader than this. Ironically, the information overload of our modern times can lead us to become more narrow-minded. We must therefore always seek information from reliable and authoritative sources and be aware of the influences behind our thinking and world view. Today we are much more aware of the reality of 'unconscious' bias. The gospel calls on us to actively work to correct for this in our perceptions and interactions with others. We must try to understand the other's point of view even if we don't agree with it, to have any hope of building bridges across the divide.

It all boils down to what is in our hearts – that deepest center of our lives and consciousness and action. What or who does it belong to? If it belongs to God, if we have God at our center, then we have hope and love and wisdom. Everything falls into the right order.


