# 20 March 2022, 3rd Sunday of Lent

### Repent and Grow

In this week's Gospel the Fig Tree Parable inspires us to realise our full potential and never stop growing in the social fabric of our lives. Lent is a time to reflect on our behaviour and change what is not good in the way we relate to others. Growing ourselves has twofold benefits -first we grow ourselves as individuals but in doing this we grow in realisation of leaving our footprint on this world and making it a better place. As members of the Body of Christ we are called to strive for cultural, economic and social conditions that will nurture all people in our nation, and wider afield.

Recent events in Aotearoa and throughout the World, remind us that we have great challenges ahead to be Peacemakers. Pope Francis leads us in a simple prayer that can help us on our journey towards peace-Lord, grant me the grace to become a good Christian, because I cannot do it on my own.' It could be daunting trying to solve even some of our own social problems in New Zealand, such as the increasing number of New Zealand children born into poverty. However together we can make bigger steps towards creating a society that promotes respect and love of all people, no matter what race, religion, gender affiliation, relationship status, mandate beliefs, or any other defining description of a person.

When we follow in the footsteps of Jesus we are called to listen to others who we may not understand, and not to make judgements. Life is difficult for many in these fragmented times, but being open to others in their fears and anxieties can go a long way in improving their wellbeing.

This week we have taken time for prayer in silence to remember those victims of the Mosque shooting. Some very uplifting themes have evolved since March 15th 2019, including the acceptance that as a very multicultural society, we will be enriched when we open our hearts to those who are different from us. On Tuesday I heard the live broadcast of the adhan (call to prayer) by Gamal Fouda, the Iman of Al Noor in Christchurch-this was eerie but beautiful. I listened to a young Muslim woman, who had lost a family member in the shooting, talk about a movement she is involved in to promote peace, she was inspiring, this was followed by Cat Stevens/Yusef singing the "Peace Train."

As our eyes turn in sadness to the war in Ukraine, we feel helpless but our prayer and giving can help. Our belief in a God of unconditional love, and our willingness to get on board the Peace Train will make a difference.

Over the last few days we have honoured St Patrick and our beloved hard working St Joseph quietly in our own homes. This year life is not as we know it, but out of the barren conditions, with God's love we will receive graces that will revive us. Next week 25th March, marks the centenary of St Mary of the Angels Church, because of the restrictions of the Red traffic light framework, the celebrations have been postponed until a later date. Finally we continue to pray for all those in our Parish family who are affected by Covid and not able to be with us in our Parish of St Mary of the Angels at this time. May they be uplifted by our prayers and care.
