100 Years of St Mary of the Angels Church

One hundred years ago, on Sunday 26 March 1922, Archbishop Francis Redwood blessed the newly completed St. Mary of the Angels Church and celebrated Holy Mass. While we have decided as a Parish community to postpone the Centenary celebrations of the present St. Mary of the Angels, it is appropriate this week to discuss the history of this iconic Church.

The Church blessed by Archbishop Redwood replaced the Church seriously damaged by fire in 1918 - which had been built in 1874. Initially, the concrete interior of the new 1922 St Mary of the Angels Church was mostly unadorned. Over the next decade or so, stained-glass windows were added to the original Crucifixion window. These windows were inspired by scriptural themes of Christ's Parables and Miracles, as well as devotional panels for the 15 Mysteries of the Rosary, incidents in the life of Joseph, saints connected with Ireland, France, Oceania, and other Missions. A couple of smaller stained-glass windows that survived the 1918 fire were re-used in the Sanctuary area of St Joseph's Chapel. The largest window at the back of the Church is associated with Music: St Cecilia and many angels - commonly called a 'rose window' - like the petals of a flower. The motif of 'angels' pervades the aesthetic of the Church: according to my count there are 93 angelic images in the Church.

On a personal level, I have a long association with St. Mary of the Angels. I was baptised, an Altar Server and ordained as a priest at St. Marys. Several years ago, I had the joy of celebrating my 50th Jubilee. Many things have changed in this time.

An annual feature till Vatican II, I recall, was the celebration of the 40 Hours Eucharistic Adoration - with the Monstrance enthroned above the tabernacle and countless candelabra with lighted candles and multitudes of flowers. Lots of preparation for the devotional highlight. Often, on the first Sunday of the month, evening devotions featured a Eucharistic Procession around the Church - down Joseph's aisle, under the Choir loft and then along the Mary's Chapel aisle... sometimes with primary school girls tossing flower petals, Vincentians carrying a Canopy over the Blessed Sacrament, and servers with thuribles and candles. An impressive event.

I am grateful for the place of St. Mary of the Angels in my own life, principally for the graces received, Sacraments celebrated, and the friends I have made. I pray also for the Parish community of St. Mary of the Angels and St. Joseph's at this time.
