3 April 2022, 5th Sunday of Lent

Every day we come in contact with optimists and pessimists, and traits of both are part of ourselves. The pessimist takes a captive view of the human condition. A captive of the good old days of what is not anymore and will never be again. The optimist looks to the bright side of things, being creative and dynamic, has confidence in life.

From the outset of this Gospel it is very clear that the Pharisees who bring an Adulterous woman to Jesus are not honest. Jesus bends down and starts doodling on the ground with his finger, indicating that He is bored and not interested in their hypocritical nonsense, very much as we doodle when bored!

This defenceless woman, who is now the centre of attention at the temple precincts is being used by Pharisees setting a real trap for Jesus, quoting the law of Moses. This would mean that such a woman should be stoned to death. Which would have been for the woman herself a lighter sanction than to be exposed to shame and degradation like this. If the matter were left to her choice instant death by stoning would have been more preferable. Why take the trouble of dumping her at Jesus' feet for Him to make her clean as He knew how!

The Scribes and the Pharisees were scheming to use her case as a trap to trip Jesus up when they asked Him, "What do you say". If Jesus' answer had of been, "Have mercy on her spare her", they would have quoted clearly that it was against Moses' law. If Jesus said," go ahead and stone her". They would have come back and said, you are not as you present yourself to be after all, merciful. Either way they would have found fault with Jesus.

Jesus answer was, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her". One by one they departed. Perhaps they had all committed adultery without being caught.

The last little bit between Jesus and the woman, "Go I will not condemn you." God is a God of Love, Forgiveness, Compassion. Caring, Reaching out and Merciful. Have faith in Him.

We are all sinners, how easy it is to judge others and be ready to condemn them. We need to look into our own lives. There are opportunities for us to do so in preparation for Easter, Reconciliation here each day at SMoA, and Communal Reconciliation at St. Joseph's church on 5th April at 7pm. We are all invited to attend. These times and places are in the Angelus. Please take one
