12 June 2022, The Most Holy Trinity

The Celebration of the Holy Trinity

Immediately after the journey of Easter the Church gives us three very important celebrations: Pentecost, Trinity, Corpus Christi (Body & Blood of Jesus). Just before we settle back into a normal daily routine of life and Sunday Liturgies, these three celebrations teach us deeply about our Christian identity and purpose in life. We can imagine it as like three special gifts for your daily life. Pentecost invites us to remember and experience the gift of the Holy Spirit into our hearts. Trinity Sunday invites us to remember and experience the call to communion; be involved in a loving and self-giving relationship with God. Corpus Christi invites us to remember and receive with joy the 'eucharist-good gift' of the body and blood of Jesus. Each celebration reminds us we are now living in 'holy and loving communion' — we have become one with God who is Holy and loving.

As we celebrate Trinity Sunday, I remember clearly a mother of 4 young girls some years ago sharing with. She simply reflected how much she loved her children. Every day she felt so much love for them. She said she would love to be able to take a part of her spirit and place this spirit-gift into their hearts to 'be with them', 'guide them', 'be a constant experience and bond of love in them'. I remember thinking this was a wonderful expression of the gift of the Holy Spirit planted in our hearts.

Jesus says in the gospel today 'I have so much more to share with you, but it will be too much for you now'. This sounds like an excited friend very much wanting to spend time together. Jesus continues.... But when the 'gift of the spirit comes' this presence will support and 'guide you to all truth'.

Possibly the most important truth is to realise 'who God is' and 'who we are' as loved by God. Today, Jesus reveals God and our relationship together: 'everything the Father has is mine', and 'the spirit will take from what is mine and declare it to you'. We glimpse the inner life of the Trinity; God who is revealed to us as Father, Son, Holy Spirit. Three 'self-giving' persons within one divine nature; a picture of a complete self-giving union of love. We can see this reflected in family life of Mother, Father, and Child. Three is an image of love always going out toward the 'other'. Our extraordinary calling is for our human family to become a holy family to reflect the 'holy trinity'.

As we continue these three great celebrations, you may like to google a very famous icon of the trinity (Rublev Trinity Icon). It is 'theology in color'. You will see an empty space for each of us at the table of the altar. God, who is Trinity, now invites us to physically join into the life of love with God in the 'holy communion' of the eucharist. Let's enjoy knowing, living, and sharing about this God of extraordinary love.



NZ Catholic bishops in solidarity with Nigeria church massacre victims

Catholics in Aotearoa New Zealand stand in solidarity and prayer with the parishioners of St Francis Xavier Church in Owo, Ondo state, Nigeria, following the monstrous atrocity committed at their Pentecost Sunday Mass.

Unidentified armed men attacked the church during Mass, killing as many as 50 parishioners and wounding many more. It was a shocking tragedy in what is the normally peaceful south-western part of Nigeria.

The Catholic Bishops of Aotearoa support the message sent by Pope Francis to Bishop Jude Ayodeji Arogundade and the faithful of Ondo Diocese, conveying the Pope's sorrow at the attack and assuring His Holiness's spiritual closeness for those affected by the "act of unspeakable violence."

We also note and affirm the comments by the National President of the Catholic Laity Council of Nigeria, Sir Henry Yunkwap, that ordinary Nigerians are tired of words from their political leaders and want action, including the urgent arrest and prosecution of the perpetrators of this evil act.

Nigeria has experienced growing lawlessness in recent years, much of it directed against its Christian communities, who are about 45 per cent of the population. Sunday's attack happened a week after the head of the Methodist Church in Nigeria was abducted and a ransom demanded for his release. Two Catholic priests were kidnapped a fortnight ago in the home state of Muhammadu Buhari, the President of Nigeria. Many New Zealanders will recall the horror of the kidnapping of Christian schoolgirls by a terrorist group. Churches have been attacked before, but not with the savagery seen on Sunday.

New Zealanders have a particular empathy with the victims of atrocities at religious places, because of our recent experience of the tragedies at the mosques in Christchurch in 2019.

We ask all New Zealand Catholics to pray for their sister and brother parishioners in Owo and to pray for peace in Nigeria. We stand too with Pope Francis in praying "for the conversion of those blinded by hatred and violence, so that they will choose instead the path of peace and righteousness."
