19 June 2022, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The Body and Blood of Jesus Christ

What are your most precious memories? How many of them involve meals or connections with family or friends? There is something very special about gathering as a whanau, especially after a significant event such as a birth, death or marriage. Memories can have a great impact on our everyday lives. No doubt the early Christians, after the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus, felt excited and amazed. The gospel accounts retell some of their memories. What are they going to do now, that Jesus, their teacher and leader, has left them?

We have just celebrated the feast of Pentecost, the gift of the Holy Spirit. Now the euphoria of the Easter season is over. The long, slow grind of winter is upon us. No more long weekends after Matariki celebration. How do we keep our spirits up and carry out the work of Jesus in everyday life?

Today's scriptures remind us of ways that we are equipped for this task of taking the gospel into everyday life. We follow the example of Melchizadek, being priests and interceding for others. We do this in prayer and by offering sacrifices in our daily lives, choosing to live for others.

The gospel reading of the loaves and fishes reminds us of God's ability to provide abundantly, even when we seem to have little ourselves. We hear of "Give a Little" pages that help special causes. It's so amazing to see how small gifts add up for such causes. Our task of taking the gospel of Jesus into the world is a special task. It requires that we give our all to this task. Blessed Frederick Ozanam, founder of the Society of St Vincent de Paul, wrote "In my life, I want to become better and do a little good." A simple description of our challenge.

The Eucharist is the final part of this group of readings. The time when we have been unable to be present at Mass, during COVID, has been a great challenge. It reminds us how we are sustained on our Christian journey. Jesus has not left us. He is always with us. Every time we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ we are renewed.




