24 July 2022, 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading this Sunday does sound a bit like a Brit satirical sketch on social media or TV, where Abraham is standing before God negotiating about how many good people may actually still exist in Sodom and Gomorrah. It sounds comical. The truth is we are as deeply immersed in social defects in our day as they were then. Today we are in what the Americans call The Culture Wars, that are leading to the implosion of democracy as we know it. The Culture Wars, as Ardern says frequently, are alive and well in New Zealand; just recall the Christchurch Mosque massacre. The Culture Wars happen when different classes no longer tolerate each other, become alienated and start hating each other. It is when women hate men and men hate women. It is when people who are pro-abortion and anti-abortion start warring. It is when someone from one race hates someone from another. It is when pro-gun and anti-gun fight. It is detesting someone who is gender fluid or LGBTQ+. It is what James K Baxter once called "Labour mum and National dad, left to howl and grumble, growl and fight, the love they kill won't let them rest, two birds that peck in one fowl nest."

The Catholic Church teaching [Gaudium et Spes 39] is clear, that our universe is evolving to a new heaven and a new earth. For zillions of years before us and zillions after us, all the universes will have evolved to be more like God, from which they come. But there are still nasty and sordid people in the world, even Christians, who are deeply and uncritically immersed in The Culture Wars, who oppose this evolution to something better taking place. They just want to cling what suits them best.

One big thing for us believers to remember is that in the end God will make sure everything will be bought to perfection. As Jesus suggests in this Sunday's gospel, better to turn to God and ask for help not to be nasty. Maybe there will only be 50 or just 10 of us who do. Who knows? But at least we will have likely filled the gaps between us with respect, kindness, friendship and hospitality in our day. Which is the Jesus way. The Kiwi way.


