#### Look Afresh at All Around You

Next weekend we celebrate the centenary of this church. 100 years it has been standing in this place.

To look back and remember just some of the events that have occurred during those 100 years will give us reason to admire the deep and tenacious faith of previous generations – faith which has gifted us this church today: the fire which swept away the original church in 1918 when the First World War was still raging; the great Depression of the late 1920's and early 30's which so scarred a generation of New Zealanders; and then the Second World War, much closer to New Zealand because of the war in the Pacific; the boom years of the 1950's which proved to be a slight respite before the social revolution which washed through New Zealand in the 1960's and 70's, immediately followed by the economic upheaval of the 1980's and 90's. During the 1960's the Second Vatican Council also took place – an event which dramatically shook the catholic world. Much there to ponder!

And in pondering upon these past events we are called to look forward and remember that not one of us living right now will be around when the next centenary is celebrated! That thought alone is a challenge for us: what can we do to ensure, as past generations did, that this church will not be just a pile of stones but something alive and vital in the midst of Wellington? Is our faith as deep and tenacious as theirs?

These past generations, each of them in their own way, ask a question of us: Will I be mentioned at the next centenary? Could it be through my life as a missionary, as a priest, through healing others, through my music, through my writing? What can I do to build up true communion, the communion of faith, amidst such diversity? In short, what can I do to bring life to this church?

I want to encourage you to get to know your church better in the days leading up to the centenary. Wander around, look afresh at all that is familiar. Read the names on the brass plaques, study the statues and the stained-glass windows, reflect on the marble altars, the wooden lectern and chair.

In silence, think and wonder, then pray.

Know your church! Love your church! And then you will want to play your part in handing it on to a generation 100 years from now.



# Update from Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) August 2022





St Mary of the Angels and St Joseph's - a shared history and a new future together.

#### PPC – setting aside time for Reflection and Spiritual Formation

With the impact of winter busy-ness, the conclusion of the Archdiocese Synod process and absences for various reasons, it has been several weeks since the PPC have been able to gather. At the end of July (most of us) were able to meet for an afternoon of reflection and spiritual formation. We all know it is important to set time aside for prayer; to listen for the prompting of the Spirit and as a faith community, we all do this already – in the Mass or in private prayer. To 'retreat' for a deliberate time of reflection



is an ancient practice and one that is thoroughly recommended to anyone active in the service of our Parish. As a group which holds the pastoral care of our parish people very much at heart, this recent experience for our PPC gathering was certainly nourishing – and will have its reward.

So – refreshed for the journey ahead, here is what is top of mind:

 St Mary of the Angels Church Centennial and a welcome back for Te Ara a Maria.

Over the weekend of Friday 12 August, Saturday 13 and Sunday 14 August, a series of events is to be held, including stories, music, prayer and thanksgiving, concluding with a Mass to welcome back the pilgrim image of Our Lady: *Te Ara a Maria*. Look out for the programme in the Angelus and via the App.

Our incorporated Parish – one year old

The Incorporation of St Joseph's and the formation of the extended St Mary of the Angel's Parish is officially just one year old – as at 1<sup>st</sup> August 2021. There is much to celebrate when we think about all that connects us and a sense of gratitude in knowing we are looking at the future together.



#### Housing Project.

At the St Joseph's end of the parish, the work to explore how the parish might be involved in the provision of social housing continues. This is a work of some complexity and we are grateful for those who are carefully working through each stage. Consultation with the St Joseph's community and the provision of periodic updates is in progress.

#### Looking beyond COVID

While COVID and winter ailments are still a presence with us, we are optimistic about how we look to our future. There is plenty going on – activities with our young adults, spiritual formation and sacramental programmes, committed prayer and ministry groups. Our numbers attending Mass are somewhat reduced on pre-COVID levels, as are visitor numbers to the capital. What this might tell us, is how important it is to keep in contact with those we don't see as often.

"Beyond COVID" is likely to be a key theme for some time to come. In the meantime, please keep these and all the works of love that are active in our parish, in your prayers.

#### And finally.....

This post from the Sisters of Compassion Facebook page is worth looking at. Both St Mary of the Angels Church and the St Joseph's community have a strong connection with the life and works of Suzanne Aubert – Meri Hōhepa.
