"Go out to all the world and tell the good news."

Time is precious and it does not stand still. We are caught up in the business of everyday life, so much so that sometimes we just need to stop, breath slowly and appreciate the beauty of the natural world around us, and the people who make up our community.

We are certainly living in a world where there are daily uncertainties, but this is more reason for us to celebrate the diversities within our Church community of St Mary of the Angels Parish, to listen to the voices of others with an open heart, and to be inclusive to all.

Through our Synod workshop discussions last year, it became evident, that although there were several resounding themes, one being more laity involvement in liturgies, we all see the world from different lens. One model or viewpoint does not fit all. But there is certainly a culture for exploring different ways of doing things. The way we justify our reasons for our behaviour, does not necessarily resonate with all. Being open to different possibilities is a key to Parish development.

Getting more people involved in our liturgical celebrations and the seeds that are sown from our community sharing can only make us stronger. Community growth comes from harvesting the gifts of others, using the charisms they offer and building the community into a dynamic living Body of Christ, where the door is open to all. In today's gospel we hear of the narrow door that not all are able to enter. I like to interpret this Gospel, as one challenging us to see how we can open the door to many.

Last weekend our St Mary of the Angels Centenary celebrations, provided an opportunity to remember our ancestors, and to focus on the presence of the Catholic Faith in central Wellington over the last century. It was also a time to focus on the future-how we continue to be relevant today. Recent Covid times, have reminded us that we the people, the Body of Christ, can transcend the need for Church buildings by maintaining a presence of faith filled communities that integrate people from a number of different cultures, sexual orientations, relationship types and sociological backgrounds. As we continue to evolve as the Body of Christ in Aotearoa, we can harness the positive energy of those around us and remember there is room for everyone to have a voice and to be heard.

Jesus has the last word in one sentence that provides us with peace, and helps us navigate the world. "I am the way, the truth, and the life," says the Lord.


