#### No one likes to be in debt

Often the direction of our lives is dominated by the removal of debts we have incurred. The dreaded student loan is often the first river to cross. Then comes the mortgage. Aptly, mortgage comes from the French meaning 'death pledge.' But not all debts are monetary. The uncomfortable feeling of receiving a generous gift often stems from the felt obligation to pay them back. I have a tendency to resent long emails as I know I'll have to sit down and write them a reply of a similar length. Behind all of this is the sense that when we owe someone, we are never truly free. In our modern world, anything that restricts my individualism is evil and so all debt is looked on as unjust slavery.

In the classical understanding of the virtue of justice, being in debt is the usual state of life. Because our existence and survival depend on others, our life is a constant ebb and flow of debts. Coming to terms with this is part living of living in the truth. Humility is the recognition and acceptance of my dependency on others.

Related to this is the virtue of *religion* which is the recognition that by the creation and upholding of my being I am *indebted* to God in a way that cannot be paid back. The disparity between what God gives me and what I can return cannot be overcome. This lies behind the natural impulse to sacrifice and explains the tone of excess which characterises our worship of God. Similarly, the old virtue of *piety* is founded on the realisation that a child can never fully pay back the debt owed to parents. The duty and honour given to one's parents are the child's way of acknowledging this debt.

In both cases, there is no strict obligation to give back. We can ignore or reject our debts to God and others or submit to them. At this risk of being grandiose, this is the choice between heaven and hell. Satan in *Paradise Lost* makes this explicit:

The debt immense of endless gratitude, So burdensome, still paying, still to owe; Forgetful what from him I still received, And understood not that a grateful mind By owing owes not, but still pays, at once Indebted and discharged; what burden then?

The latter part of our Gospel this Sunday, encourages us to accept our indebtedness. We should give generously without considering what we will get in return. We knowing that what we owe to God and others is far greater than what is owed to me.

We should also graciously accept the debt of asking for help. This can be a challenge for those growing older. After a life of self-sufficiency, it can be difficult to ask for help, that is, to incur a debt. Jesus reminds us that asking for help gives another the opportunity to receive repayment... when the virtuous rise again.'


