A Fathers Love

Last Sunday we celebrated "Father's Day" and we hear of a father's love for his two sons in today's Gospel reading. The parable of the prodigal son is one we are all familiar with. We know it as the parable of the prodigal son, but a more fitting title for this parable would be "A Father's Love." It's a story of God's love for us. With both sons, the father proves how much he loves them both by his words and actions.

The Scribes and the Pharisees who would have been listening to Jesus as he told this parable, would have very much disapproved of the actions of the father. They would have pointed out that the father should never have allowed his younger son to take his share of the family inheritance, and go away. But the father does allow his son an incredible freedom to go his own way, and to make his own mistakes.

According to Jewish law and customs, the father made another mistake when he welcomed his son back so lovingly and celebrating his return with a banquet. The older son can feel rightly aggrieved at how his father has welcomed back his younger brother, and yet the father comes out, once again showing his fatherly love by reassuring him that all that he has is his.

What happened to the two sons after their encounters with their loving father is not known. The parable does not answer that scenario because it's the wrong scenario to reflect on. What Jesus wants us to ask is: where is the father at the end of the story? "The Father" is not to be found in the place of honour, but outside, still seeking his rebellious sons and daughters.

The Church takes us back to this parable of Jesus of its importance. We heard it during the season of Lent, to be read so that we might reflect more deeply in our preparation for Easter. We need to be reminded at all times that we often search for God in the wrong places. He is with us in our darkness and anger, seeking us out and telling us: All that I have is yours.


