#### 16 October 2022, 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Downy nestlings calling for food with wide open beaks....they are quickly fed! Jesus might have used this image to convey the value of unfailing prayer. He preferred, however, to use the story from human life, of the obstinate widow, whose persistence finally secured justice from an uncooperative judge.

We should not conclude from this gospel account that the way to pray to God is to be persistent: only the pagans imagine that they will be heard from their many words. On the other hand, equally, God is not a judge who would be careless about administering justice. He does wish though that we continue to put our needs before Him. The lack of good will in the judge in the parable should make us understand that God will unfailingly give satisfaction to those who ask. And equally, as against the slowness of that judge, He will not delay to do so.

The lessons of the parable are clear: the problem for us is that God seems to remain silent and inactive in spite of our petitions. By encouraging His followers to persevere in asking, Jesus suggests the relationships between faith and prayer. Certainly He nurtured no illusions on this score: when the Son of Man comes, will He find any faith on earth? All the same, faith has need of the breath of prayer if it is to flower in good works and remain alert and not grow weak and fade away. It is the same as our bodies need of food, the plants' need of water. It is because our faith is a living reality and cannot continue if it is not lived, that we "pray continually and never lose heart".

The widow's prayer indicates that prayer for what is just, for what is good, is also a prayer that God promptly responds to. Just and good, however, not from our point of view but from God's.

Being attentive and asking for a grace, a desire, helps us listen more deeply to God. Beginning our prayer by asking for a grace reminds us that prayer is not a high -powered negotiation session for a particular request but rather a rich conversation with God.

In the end God decides what to give. On our part we keep in touch and wait for his response. Praying always helps us to remain faithful and persevering. For whoever perseveres to the end will save their life.


