6 November 2022, 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

November is a special month for remembering in prayer our loved ones who have passed away. As we have celebrated 'All Saints' and 'All Souls' at the beginning of the month, we also enter a beautiful month of memory and prayer for all our loved ones who have passed away. This provides us with both an opportunity to reflect on the faith examples who have gone before us in the 'saints' and also our parents and friends whose lives and love we miss. You may remember the faith witness of Mum or Dad; their sacrifices of love, service, and commitment. I remember my Mum kneeling morning and evening at her bedside in prayer, quite unknowing that I saw this often. My Dad tired after work yet still giving his talent to draw technical designs for the local swimming pool and serve in the local community college and parish council. Our loved ones memory still witnesses and nourishes our life and faith journey.

The month of November also stirs up our hope. As St Paul states: we will all be together again. We remind ourselves of a central truth of our Christian belief: the Resurrection. We say this deep and joyful truth in our Christian Creed each Sunday. Jesus was victorious over sin and death, rose again on the third day, and ascended into heaven.... We believe in the communion of saints, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting.

This topic of the Resurrection was part of the argument in the gospel reading today between Sadducees (who did not believe in the resurrection), and Jesus (who came to reveal the resurrection). God is "God, not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all people are in fact alive". The Resurrection is not just something that 'happens at our death', but is a truth that we are invited to let permeate our lives today. Pope Benedict XVI shared a beautiful phrase in his teaching Spe salvi (saved in Hope). Our faith is 'not to be simply informative, but performative'; Christian faith is not just some interesting information or 'good news', but rather a powerful message that makes things happen and is lifechanging. If you won lotto with the winning lotto ticket, it does not just stay as 'information'. It creates a knowledge that moves us into action. Victory over sin and death and the truth of the resurrection is not just something that affects us at the end of our life. Our faith knowledge shapes and creates in us a profound awareness of God's power and victory over all evil. Like the 'lotto ticket', knowing this we also live inside this event and engage in partnership in this victory through our lives and actions. We too look forward with joy filled hope in the resurrection and the gift of everlasting life. As St Paul says: 'death where is your sting'... 'death where is your victory'. 'Death has been swallowed up in the victory of Jesus' resurrection' (1Cor 15,54). Let's remember the examples of all our saints and all the souls of those who have gone before us, a great support crew for our lives and the life of the faith community. And we look forward to being together with them all in heaven too.


