Anxiety or the King?

War in Ukraine, troubling political elections in America and Brazil, floods in Australia and the Philippines, war in Myanmar, drought in Kenya and the Horn of Africa, on going conflict in the Palestinian Territories, political upheaval in Great Britain, an energy crisis throughout Europe particularly but the world as well. The list seems endless — and dispiriting! Then, here in New Zealand, inflation is soaring, mortgages are becoming increasingly burdensome, there is talk of increasing unemployment, ram raids and street violence seem to be daily news, the covid virus is still hanging around. No wonder, we might think, there is so much talk of anxiety, depression, of mental health issues. What is there to give us hope? Is there a future for us, for the world?

My answer to this troubling, disturbing question is a call, a challenge: "Look to the King!"

Just to be clear, I'm not talking of King Charles who recently acceded to the throne of England upon the death of his mother, Elizabeth, who for so long had been a steady presence in an unsteady world. Charles is too distant, too ambiguous, too human to be an answer.

I am talking of Jesus Christ - Christ the King. This is the feast we celebrate next Sunday. On the last Sunday of the Church's year, the Sunday before we begin the season of Advent, the Church turns our eyes to the future to reassure us that our present moment will pass. God's plan is mysteriously unfolding and all will be well. Christ, at some unknown point in a hidden future, will bring all Creation home to the Father.

Go back to the opening chapters of the Book of Genesis, the very first book in the Bible. In those chapters we read two different stories of how Creation unfolded. The first tells us in a measured and repetitive way, so calming and reassuring, that God created everything for a purpose. And this purpose is good. The second story is comforting and consoling. It reveals God to be lovingly solicitous for his people. In ways unimaginable He is a constant companion, never abandoning us.

Jesus' coming amongst us reveals this. His journey to the cross and beyond, into the depths of Hell, is the sure sign that he will not abandon us when life is burdensome beyond bearing. More, he shows us the way forward, the way of Salvation. Christ has conquered the powers of darkness. He is King of Creation. Even now, amidst all the complex, depressing mess of our present-day world, there is purposeful goodness mysteriously at work. We profess this to be true. But do we believe it?

Perhaps we could enter into the spirit of this feast of Christ the King and, at the same time, prepare for the birth of our King by reading and re-reading the first two chapters of the Book of Genesis and so hear more deeply its drumbeat of hope: "He saw that it was good".



"May this 2022 World Day of the Poor be for us a moment of grace. May it enable us to make a personal and communal examination of conscience and to ask ourselves whether the poverty of Jesus Christ is our faithful companion in life." (Pope Francis, 13 June 2022).

In his message for the sixth World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis acknowledges that whilst moving from long periods of COVID-19-induced isolation, we find ourselves facing great separation in Aotearoa New Zealand. The pandemic exacerbated divisions in society, with people disconnected from their communities. Today is intended for all Catholics to work with people who are poor and marginalised, rebuilding bonds in communities and working in partnership.

Pope Francis tells us that "solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community. It means that the lives of all are prior to the appropriation of goods by a few. It also means combatting the structural causes of poverty" (Fratelli Tutti, 2020, para. 116). Everyone is wealthy in different ways and can offer something to promote human dignity and the common good. We should all seek to be poor in spirit, and rich in action, love, and community. On this World Day of the Poor, consider, what are you rich in, and how can you become poor in spirit?

If blessed with time, how are we giving this time to those around us, people who may not be given the time of day?

If blessed with wealth, how are we encouraging subsidiarity, and giving to what people are actually asking for?

If blessed with family, how are we welcoming other people with open arms when they have no one to turn to?

Ways to give:

Discuss how your parish can do more to open your doors to those in need.

Run a food, clothing, or school supplies collection for local charity organisations.

See if there is an Orange Sky bus working in your area and donate your time sitting with people while they do their laundry.
