#### 20 November 2022, The Feast of Christ the King

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, signals the *end* of the liturgical year and draws our attention to Christ's second coming in glory and power. Next week, we *begin* the season of Advent and prepare ourselves to welcome Christ's more modest arrival on Christmas Day. The mix of beginnings and endings here is deliberate; the Church is confronting us with the paradox of Christ.

I remember when James Cameron's first *Avatar* movie arrived in the cinema. We excitedly purchased our 3D Glasses with their blue and red lenses. I recall taking the glasses on and off during the movie, just to experience the difference between the fuzzy flat image and the living image full of depth and surprise. Back then, this seemed like magic. Now I know that the 3D Glasses feed the eyes different images by filtering cyan and red light thus 'tricking' the brain into triangulating depth.

Our readings this Sunday encourage us to clean and put on our 3D Glasses of faith.

The blue lens is the divinity of Christ. St. Paul reminds us that Jesus Christ is the all -powerful King of the Universe, ... before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. In short, Jesus is God. In the Gospel from Luke, the Roman soldiers mock Jesus, little understanding that Christ's kingship is mysteriously beyond anything they could imagine. Without the eyes of faith, they see merely a broken man crucified alongside other criminals.

When our blue lens of faith becomes dirtied, we can start to treat aspects of our faith flippantly too. This can manifest in our approach to the Eucharist, which is not just a piece of bread or even a merely a symbol of Christ's body, but Christ present body, soul, blood, and divinity. This can also occur in our behaviour in the sacred space of the Church, or in the way we speak about sacred things.

The red lens is the humanity of Christ. In the season Advent, we will see Jesus Christ arrive as a powerless human infant; God becomes like us in all things but sin. What's more, our Gospel from Luke *does* present a God who is crucified alongside other criminals. Jesus Christ accepts humiliating suffering and death of a human criminal on the Cross. He does this because God wants all things to be reconciled through him and for him, that is, for the forgiveness of sins.

When our red lens is dirty, we can find ourselves repulsed by the gritty human reality of our faith. The words and gestures of our liturgy, the touching, and things of the seven Sacraments, and most particularly the Church (full of sinful people) can seem too unclean for God. We are reminded that the Church is the *Body* of Christ.

Whichever lens we need to clean, let us take this week to do so. In this way, our approach towards Christmas will be filled with mysterious wonder at the God become man, Jesus Christ. *Vivat Christus Rex*!




