Christmas and Advent

"The days are surely coming" (Jr 33:14). The Israelites had to wait patiently for 1500 years until the fulfilment of this prophecy. However, we did not. Since the beginning of the Church we have had the privilege of knowing the precise date and manner in which the Messiah came amongst us. We also know that Jesus continues to come amongst us at every celebration of the Eucharist. How would the Israelites have acted if they had had this knowledge? On the surface I think they would have continued living an ordinary life while within they would have been restless with anticipation.

Sometimes it is harder to care about something which has happened many times before, the details of which are well known. If I watch the film "The Good, the Bad and the Ugly" for a second or third time, I am less uneasy when I watch the Mexican-standoff scene because I know which characters will survive. However, I still continue to watch the film. The second viewing of the film is still worth it though I know what will happen, because I can enjoy the subtleties of the scene, the music, the background and character expressions. Although I will miss the novelty aspect, each viewing allows me to gain a deeper appreciation for Sergio Leone's directing, Ennio Morricone's score composition, and Clint Eastwood's grimaces.

Just as I immerse myself in "The Good, the Bad and the Ugly" time and time again - and always gain something from that - so I join each year in the celebration of Christmas Day. In this way I am able to deepen my faith and hope in the coming of Christ amongst us at Bethlehem.

Something similar happens as I prepare for Christmas Day.

A somewhat long 'to-do list' looms in the back of my mind. Work parties and other gatherings await during this period, alongside visits to the optometrist, the dentist, and the hairdresser. Although this ensures top condition for the holiday season, if the tasks were the sole aim, they would become meaningless.

The Season of Advent helps me to avoid that lack of meaning. It helps me prepare to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas Day. His coming amongst us in each Mass during this season is an opportunity to gain a deeper appreciation of God's promises that have been fulfilled. Though much, much shorter than the 1500 years the Israelites waited for the fulfilment of the prophecy, the Season of Advent is, for me, a period of waiting when I can deepen my hope in the return of Christ in his glory.



Bach Choir


