A Merry Messy Christmas

This Sunday we have the background Christmas story from Joseph's perspective in the Gospel of Matthew. Next week, we will experience how Jesus came to arrive at Christmas from Mary's perspective in the Gospel of

It can sound rather tidy in a book, but it's helpful to take the time to ponder the feelings and experiences of Christmas for Joseph and Mary. We can find the historical story of Christmas is much closer and personal for us today. Their story becomes our story too.

If your year has not worked out as planned; Mary and Joseph understand – all their plans were changed. If you are struggling with the faithfulness and commitment of your spouse; Mary and Joseph understand - they had difficult conversations but tried to respect each other's feelings and dignity (Mat 1,25). If you are not feeling accepted or welcomed by family; Mary and Joseph understand – they traveled pregnant for days to Jerusalem in the sun on a donkey and couldn't find a bed with family in Bethlehem (Mat 2,4). If you are struggling with money and finding accommodation difficult; Mary and Joseph understand - they could only afford an animal shelter among lowly animals and straw (Luke 2,7). If you are worried about how you can provide for and guide your children with all the challenges of today; Mary and Joseph understand – they realized they were only servants of the mystery of life with God and God was ultimately in control (Luke 2,51). If you are wary of government and laws that limit freedom; Mary and Joseph understand - they lived in the time of King Herod who was so fearful of the future he killed children (Mat 2,16). If you experience the hardships of migrant life in another culture and language; Mary and Joseph understand they had to try and learn the new language and culture of Egypt as refugees (Mat 2,13). How did they make it through these experiences – they listened to God in prayer and in the depths of their heart and soul – and believed that trust in God and faithfulness to this inner voice of God would bring them through.

We may try and have a tidy Christmas, but let's not get too upset by the surprises of what really happens. The first Christmas was rather messy and yet God seems to be at home in our mess and our world. As we each respond YES to God in the spirit of Joseph and Mary's, we too continue to allow God to work powerfully in our world today. In a very real way, we continue the incarnation - putting flesh to God's words in prayer - and allow Christ to be birthed in our hearts and homes and community. A merry - messy - and prayer-full Christmas everyone.



FINANCIAL UPDATE ON THE PARISH OF ST MARY OF THE ANGELS

The Finance Committee of the parish would like to share with you the current picture of the financial performance of the parish which, since August 2021, comprises two communities – St Mary of the Angels and St. Joseph's.

We have two aims in mind. The first simply is **to inform**, i.e. to allow you to see how the parish has been performing since 2021. The second is to inform you of **the increasing weakness** of the financial performance of the parish.

Some points to notice:

- The figures reported here represent the combined income and expenses of St Mary of the Angels and St. Joseph's communities in the three periods covered.
- 2. The column for 2023 is a <u>forecast</u> of income and expenses only; whereas the columns for 2021 and 2022 are <u>actual</u> income and expenses for those periods of time.
- 3. The key line is the "Net Operating Deficit". As can be seen this is increasing year on year and is likely to continue to do so in the future.
- 4. The major source of income for the parish are the Sunday and other mass collections.
- 5. The alternative sources of income that are available to the parish to help lessen the Net Operating Deficit are limited.
- 6. It is unlikely that we would be able to remove any of the expenses incurred regularly without damaging the ability of the parish to operate as you, no doubt, would wish.
- 7. The major expenses are diocesan levies for clergy support and archdiocesan support; salaries and wages; insurance premiums; and, local government rates.

In the New Year, 2023, it will be important for us to look together as a parish at ways and means we can improve our financial performance, either by increasing income, decreasing expenses or a combination of both.

Thank you for taking the time to understand the significance of this Financial Performance report. In difficult times we find ourselves facing yet another challenge!
