#### 25 December 2022, The Nativity of the Lord

There seems to be a lot of bad news these days. There is no need to make a list of everything, but if we let it, the bad news and can overwhelm us with anxiety and darkness. This feeling is compounded if we struggle with suffering and misfortune in our own lives. Perhaps, we can feel like actors in a tragedy, part of a story "...told by an idiot, full of sound and fury, signifying nothing."

The word 'Gospel' has its origin in words 'God' and 'spell.' 'Spell' was the Old English word for 'news or story, and so Gospel literally means 'God's story.' At Christmas we celebrate the revelation of good news; today, God enters into the world to share His story of love with us.

The prologue of John's Gospel (John 1:1-18) is a summary of God's story. We hear that before creation, the Son and the Father shared a communion of love and being: In the beginning was the Word: and the Word was with God and the Word was God. This proximity continued in the arrival of the Son in the flesh: No one has ever seen God; it is the only Son, who is nearest to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

For this reason, Christ's coming into the world signifies a light that darkness could not overpower because it is God Himself who walks among us. The darkness of the world, all of the bad news, cannot overpower the light of Christ. I couldn't help think of Samwise Gamgee in the land of Mordor noticing a star through the smog and darkness.

There, peeping among the cloud...Sam saw a white star twinkle for a while. ...For like a shaft, clear and cold, the thought pierced him that in the end the Shadow was only a small and passing thing: there was light and high beauty for ever beyond its reach.

We too are gathered around a star of light.

The beginning and end of John's prologue journey towards the climatic centre of God's story: But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God.

The good news gets better: not only does God wish to make his love known, He invites us to become part of his story too. The catechism teaches that God, who "dwells in unapproachable light", wants to communicate his own divine life to the men and women he freely created, in order to adopt them as his children in his only-begotten Son (1 Tim 6:16, cf. Eph 1:4-5). By revealing himself God wishes to make them capable of responding to him, and of knowing him and of loving him far beyond their own natural capacity."

Let our gratitude to be part of God's story be the source of our joy this Christmas.


