The Treaty of Waitangi

Tomorrow is the 6th of February, the day on which our nation joins together, in different ways in different places, to celebrate our founding document. Here, in the Archdiocese of Wellington, Catholics are invited to celebrate mass at St Mary of the Angels at 9.00am on Monday, February 6, with the community from Te Ngakau Tapu parish, the parish personal to Maori in the Archdiocese, to give thanks for the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi.

In 1835 Britain had accepted the Maori chief's request to recognize their independence. It was already acknowledged internationally that New Zealand was an independent country. Britain also agreed to the chief's request to extend Crown protection to New Zealand. By 1837, as disagreements, fighting and crime increased between Maori and settlers, the British Government decided it was imperative to secure Maori acceptance and co-operation in establishing New Zealand as a British colony in order to control the thousands of expected emigrants and to protect the rights of the Maori people. Lieutenant Governor Hobson was tasked with ensuring that such an agreement was reached.

Hobson arrived in New Zealand on 29 January, 1840. A meeting of chiefs was organized for a week later. Over 400 Maori attended this meeting but, after vigorous debate and disagreement on several points of the proposed Treaty, the meeting ended indecisively. The Maori then sought the advice of Henry Williams who told them that it would be in their best interests to sign the Treaty. On Williams' advice the chiefs decided to sign the Treaty, which had been amended with the insertion of a clause that guaranteed the Maori possession of their lands, forests, fisheries and other prized possessions.

The next day, February 6, over 40 chiefs signed or marked the Treaty of Waitangi. Over the next seven months the Treaty was carried around the country until more than 500 chiefs signed the Maori version of the Treaty.

What the Treaty establishes is that our modern independent state was not based on colonial conquest or the illegitimate invasion of settlers. New Zealand is founded on an agreement which continues today as a pact of partnership between Maori and Pakeha. It is an agreement which established our continuing links with the Crown; an agreement which continues to act as a national symbol of unity and understanding between cultures.

This is what we will be celebrating in the mass tomorrow morning here at St Mary of the Angels. We give thanks for the Treaty, though imperfectly implemented, because it is the guarantee for all New Zealanders, no matter who they are or where they come from, that we all belong here, we all have a place here.


