### 19 March 2023, 4th Sunday of Lent

Our Gospel today tell us of the story of the man born blind. Today a man who was born blind is cured. This is such an amazing miracle that the Pharisees need to be assured that this is really the man who was blind, and that indeed, he was blind from birth.

The miracle hides some dark questions. Who is really blind and what is the cause of our blindness? What is blindness? The cured man is challenged by the pharisees. He is surprised that they cannot see what he sees, namely that Jesus is a man from God'. He who was blind can see what those who are blind cannot see. It is the Pharisees who are blind. They cannot see what Jesus has done because their own concern is the Sabbath regulations. They find fault rather than the love of God. Like us, the problem of their particular expectations and understandings, prevent them from seeing the goodness of other people. They are blind to the presence of God.

The sick and the disabled can be a source of hope and encouragement when they show us that despite their affliction they try their best to live to the fullest each and every day. This is God's glory being made manifest. Jesus made use of the clay from the soil and water from the Pool of Siloam to heal the blind man. Nature has a healing power that we can use and see. God has provided us with everything we need to battle with diseases. Again God's glory made manifest.

Openness to God requires us to see beyond ourselves and to move out of our comfort zones. Indeed, if we look for what is wrong that is what we will see. Let's strive to see things as God sees them. The pure in heart will see God.

God's healing power is not only limited to curing the body but also the soul. When we receive the absolution in the Sacrament of reconciliation, we experience God's healing love. When we allow the Holy Spirit to come into our hearts, we begin to be cured of our spiritual blindness. And when God gives us the grace to see ourselves as we truly are, when we are enlightened as to the purpose of our existence we, too can say ,'I was blind, but now I see." Again God's glory made manifest.

### **Easter Working Bees**


