Divine Mercy Sunday

What is Divine Mercy Sunday, and how did it come about?

In a series of revelations in the 1930's to the Polish mystic, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska (25 August 1905 – 5 October 1938), Our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. "My daughter, tell the whole world about my inconceivable mercy. The Feast of Mercy emerged from my very depths of tenderness. It is my desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. The world will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy."

Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000.

The decree issued on May 5, 2000, by the Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship and The Discipline of the Sacraments clearly states: "the Supreme Pontiff John Paul II has graciously determined that in the Roman Missal, after the title Second Sunday of Easter, there shall henceforth also appear the title, 'Divine Mercy Sunday.'

Nevertheless, Divine Mercy Sunday is NOT a feast based solely on St. Faustina's revelations. Indeed, it is not primarily about St. Faustina — nor is it altogether a new feast. The Second Sunday of Easter was already a solemnity as the Octave Day of Easter (Octave here refers to the eighth day immediately following the Feast of Easter Sunday). The title "Divine Mercy Sunday" does, however, highlight the meaning of the day.

Liturgically, the Easter Octave has always been centred on the theme of mercy and forgiveness. Divine Mercy Sunday, therefore, points us to the merciful love of God that lies behind the whole Easter mystery — the whole mystery of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ — made present for us in the Eucharist. In this way, it also sums up the whole Easter Octave.

As Pope John Paul II pointed out in his talk on Divine Mercy Sunday, 1995, "The whole octave (i.e. eight days) of Easter is like a single day," and the Octave Sunday is meant to be the day of "thanksgiving for the goodness God has shown to all in the whole Easter mystery."

Given the liturgical appropriateness of the title "Divine Mercy Sunday" for the Octave Day of Easter, therefore, today is an occasion on which we are invited to think once more and deeply on the meaning of the Easter feasts we have recently celebrated - God sent his son into this world to share his mercy and forgiveness with each and every one of us.





SMAYACS - Theology on Tap: Let's Be Frank About Confession


