

Vocation Sunday

Today we are called to pray for vocations, especially for priestly and religious life. Every year for this particular Sunday the theme of the Good Shepherd is highlighted in the Gospel passage chosen, being from John 10:1-10 this year. When we hear the title "Good Shepherd" we immediately think of Jesus Christ as the Good Shepherd. But in the opening verses of this particular Gospel reading Jesus refers to the leaders of society as the Shepherds, both the good ones and the bad ones. Instead, Jesus refers to himself as the "Gate" through which the good shepherds are called to lead their flock. Jesus is the "gate" that gives entry to the Kingdom of God. The good shepherds, through faith, know that Christ is the gate they must lead their flock through. Any other entrance leads to chaos, disharmony, despair, and the scattering of the flock.

There are bad leaders and there are good leaders. The good leader of God's people must come to them through Jesus. There is only one way to enter into the sheepfold to bring wholeness and life to a flock that will recognise the shepherd who calls his sheep by name: through the "gate." Such a shepherd leads the flock into good pastures. The shepherds of God's people who are prepared to come through Jesus will be all that Christian leaders should be, for only Jesus can claim "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life." (Jn 14:6)

Today we are challenged as Church, just as we are challenged as members of the Lord's flock. As Church, do we tend the flock given into our care (family, parish, friends, those who look to us for love, care and guidance) by passing through the gate which is Jesus and the way of his Gospel, or have we developed our own way of doing things? Are we shepherds as Jesus is the Good Shepherd, laying down his life for his sheep (v.15)?

As members of the Lord's flock, living in the midst of a world that has forgotten its Lord, can we frankly say that we "do not recognise the voice of strangers," but that we listen only to the voice which we know, namely that of Jesus? Do we really know that voice of the Good Shepherd, or are the sounds of the many thieves and brigands at large in today's society too loud in our

Pray today for our young people who may be discerning a vocation to priestly and religious life that they listen and be guided by Jesus Christ who calls out to



XLT


