

### To be Missionaries of Jesus

The foundation of the Christian mission has been laid in the missionary activity of Jesus himself. Now he associates the followers he has chosen to join his mission. Seeing the plight of the people, like sheep without a shepherd, he asks his disciples to pray for workers in the harvest. However, they are not only to pray for workers in the harvest, they are commissioned to be workers in the harvest. Notice how carefully their commission repeats what has already been said of Jesus. He had cast out demons and cured all kinds of diseases and sickness. Now they are given authority to do the same. They are to repeat what Jesus had done; they are to spread the missionary activity of Jesus.

The list of names has its importance. Simon, first in the list, is given a further name: "Peter". The expression "peter" in Greek or Aramaic was never used as a person's name. It was a word meaning "rock." Reading this we may wonder what this word now used as a person's name might mean, but that story will be told later in the Gospel (16:18-20). The last name, Judas, is further qualified: "the one who was to betray him" (10:4). The list begins with a figure who will eventually be the rock upon which the Church is built, and ends with another figure who will betray Jesus. Both, however, are disciples and missionaries of Jesus.

For the moment fragile disciples are sent out to bring the message of the Kingdom of God only to the lost sheep of Israel. Later the commission will become universal. In the overall structure of Matthew's story of Jesus, this present limitation links them more closely to Jesus' mission. During his ministry, he too goes only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. After the paschal mystery, the message will be preached to all the nations. Disciples are to repeat the mission of Jesus, but only because they depend entirely upon him. They are his disciples; they are not masters. They were called by him, they received without charge; now they are to give what they have received and learnt from him without charge.

The mission of Jesus continues. We are called to repeat what Jesus did, to bring peace and healing to all who are sick, and all who are troubled. The Kingdom of God is at hand. However, in our fragility, we must recognise that we are capable of being both Peter the Rock and Judas the betrayer. We are no better than the next person. What we are given and learn from our Christian lives and experience is a gift. It is not a gift, however, to be jealously guarded within the exclusive club of the Christion Church. It has been given to us without charge. We must give without charge.
