The Virtue of Hope

Faith, Hope and Charity. We are so used to saying these three words in the same breath. Faith and Charity, I would dare say, are virtues we wrestle with often, But what of the virtue of Hope? As the years go by Hope is a virtue that should become more important to us – not as something we desperately cling to but as something encouraging, uplifting, life-giving. More a vitamin pill than a life-jacket!

I remember hope flickering strongly in the 1980's with the fall of the Iron Curtain, the name distinguishing Western European democracies from Moscow-controlled communist states. For a brief period of time world tensions eased dramatically and there was a palpable sense that a new world of peace and justice was possible. But this all-too human hope proved to be false. So much violence and destruction since then! Think of Bosnia, Palestine, Israel, Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan, Myanmar, Cambodia and now Ukraine.

One man who inspired me and many others with hope during those days when Communism was collapsing was Václav Havel, writer and politician. He was born in Prague on 5 October 1936. Because of his critical plays and essays Havel came under the surveillance of the Czech secret police, and so spent multiple periods jailed as a political prisoner. After the fall of Communism Havel served as the last president of Czechoslovakia from 1989 and then as the first president of the Czech Republic from 1993 to 2003. He died on the 16th December, 2011.

Despite being frequently punished severely for his convictions he never lost hope which he once defined as, "definitely not the same thing as optimism. Hope is not the conviction that something will turn out well, but the certainty that something makes sense, regardless of how it turns out."

Havel points us toward the true meaning of Christian Hope. Our hope is not rooted in human events, nor in a human movement or individual; only in the promises of our Resurrected Lord. For everyone, but most especially those who have fewer years ahead of them than behind them, this virtue of Hope is vital as we anxiously contemplate our past life, too often littered with broken dreams and promises.

May I share this prayer with you, a prayer I love, so as to help you cultivate the virtue of Hope.

"Eternal Father, you alone can control the days that are gone and the deeds that are done.

Remove from my burdened memory the weight of past years. Set me free from the comfort of complacency and the paralysis of remorse. Let me instead look forward trustingly in hope to what lies ahead: Life eternal with you as promised by your Son, Jesus Christ."
