13 August 2023, 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The story of Jesus walking across the water to rejoin the disciples who were in a boat away from the crowds, is dramatic. It is a scene witnessed understandably with a great deal of trepidation by the disciples who questioned the reality of what they were seeing. What happened next was even more alarming - Peter gets out of the boat. We don't really know what the other disciples thought about that, but there are no reports of anyone else following Peter's example at that moment.

The "Jesus walks on water" story is worth thinking about, not just because of the miraculous events depicted in countless stained-glass windows in churches throughout the world, but because of the reality of the experience.

Uncertainty is our reality too. In our own parish setting there are plenty of high winds and rough seas in the shape of financial challenges, work demands, family sorrows and numerous examples of dysfunction in the way our world works. There are also glimpses of Christ keeping things on track. Our young people are finding ways to connect with each other; our opportunities to increase revenue are being explored; programmes for spiritual formation for any age are in place with more in development; there are parishioners who work alongside other agencies to support those in need; there is a project, supported by our Bishops, to bring pilgrims into our parish and much more. We have the advantage of two church communities from which to work and the faithful commitment of our Pastoral Team.

At every Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) meeting, there are reports of plenty going on and plenty more ideas of where we might turn our attention. In recent times we have heard much about being a "synodal community" meaning that there is a process of prayer, sharing, listening and reflection that is appropriate for discerning the way ahead. It is an unfamiliar practice to most of us and in our clumsy way our parish community is faithful to this process. The themes that emerged from our parish participation in the 2017 and 2021-2022 Archdiocese Synods are consistent with some of the activities we see now. This is really encouraging and there is more to do.

In the months ahead, the PPC will be looking at how we prioritise our opportunities for mission. We know that when we keep our eyes on Christ and trust in His Word all will be well. Some activities are already within our reach - others invite us to get out of our boat. Keep praying.
