Ministry to the Aged, the Sick and the Dying

Did you know that there are eleven rest homes in the inner-city area of Wellington? Now think of how many residents there must be in those eleven homes. It comes to quite a large number! I must admit I was a little surprised at the numbers involved, even though we are all living longer and adverts for such homes can be found everywhere.

Some of them, like the Rita Angus Home in Kilbirnie and Village at the Park in Newtown, are rather large and cater not only for aged and sick residents but also for those requiring more intense care. Others, like the St. John of God Home in Karori, accept as residents those requiring specialized care. Of the eleven two of them are hospices, Te Hopai and Mary Potter, both close to the Public Hospital.

I only came to know of how many such homes there were, relatively close to St Mary of the Angels, when a small group of lay people already involved in this ministry began to meet once a month, early in 2022, here in our parish hall. Those involved come from different parishes but mainly from Wellington South where the majority of such rest homes are situated. The meetings started because we wanted to find ways and means of coordinating and communicating better amongst ourselves — what did our ministry look like; how often was this ministry offered; could we work together as one team based in different parishes? As we deepened our research into the reality of care for the aged, sick and dying it became evident that many Catholics, and other Christians, were not receiving the attention and care that we might presume the Church would be offering to people moving towards the end of their lives.

More than a year later we have reached the point where we have a clearer vision for a shared ministry based on improved communication and coordination, focused skills-training and on-going accompaniment. We are also aware that we need more volunteers!

We need more people who can offer some of their precious time each week to reach out and visit the elderly, the sick and the dying in a way that brings comfort and joy to them, peace and contentment because we recognize and value them. In a small way we show them they are not forgotten or ignored.

Inside this week's Angelus you will find an insert which explains better why this ministry is important and why we are inviting you to think of becoming a volunteer. Contact details are included in the insert if you wish to volunteer. We hope that you will find a space in your heart and in your weekly diary to seriously consider involving yourself in this ministry.



MINISTERING TO THE ELDERLY IN RESIDENTIAL CARE

A significant number of elderly people live in residential care homes or hospital settings where their access to the outside world is restricted.

Their faith is important for many of these people, yet access to opportunities to worship with others, to pray together and to receive the Eucharist may be seriously curtailed.

One of the ministries of our Parish is outreach to such elderly people (and their carers) through visits to rest homes and hospitals. In small groups we offer communion, prayers, support and, we hope, some joy and comfort through getting to know the residents and staff.

It is a real privilege to be able to put our faith into action in this way (and not just on Sunday) honouring people in their older age, with whatever sickness or infirmity we find them. Often we spend time talking with family members, who bear significant



worries in the anticipation of loss of their loved one. We get to know the staff in the facilities, and believe we are seen as a welcome break in the daily routine of the institution. Their work is challenging, heavy and often emotionally draining. We also spend time talking with family members, who bear significant worries in the anticipation of loss of their loved one.

Talking on this ministry requires the ability to meet people at a human and ordinary level. Compassion and caring are essential, as are observational skills, energy, the willingness to build relationships with others however we find them, and acceptance of all the stages of life including impending death. Ministers must be able to be flexible, to be supportive members of their team, and to act with integrity and kindness in all they do. A sense of fun, humour and spontaneity are helpful attributes in lightening and brightening the room.

What we receive in turn is humbling. This ministry strengthens our own faith, as we witness the courage and fortitude with which residents face their situations, and the depth of their own faith in the face of their whole lives. We build relationships, friendships even, with the elderly and the staff, and look forward to seeing them every time we visit. We miss those residents who are called home as eventually we all will be.

The ministry requires that we have the time for this regular commitment, and the ability to honestly reflect on what can sometimes be sad and scary when we contemplate our own futures. We learn from and support each other in our visiting team, and look forward to welcoming and buddying new members.
