Celebration Sunday: Mother Suzanne Aubert

Suzanne Aubert was a determined young woman who left Lyon in France in 1860 to begin her lifelong spiritual journey as soon as she was legally free to decide her own future.

As a young woman, Suzanne had repeatedly but unsuccessfully asked her parents' permission to join religious life. Finally, with freedom to decide, at the age of 25, she accepted an invitation to become a missionary for Bishop Pompallier's Auckland diocese.

After working initially at a boarding school for Maori girls, Suzanne left Auckland to work at the Marist Maori mission station at Meanee in Hawke's Bay with the Third Order of Mary. She became well known in the area ministering to Maori and Pakeha, Catholic ad non-Catholic without compromising her own beliefs. Tolerance and friendship became strategies for her mission.

In 1874 Suzanne was pinning her hopes for a revival of the Maori mission on the new Bishop of Wellington, Bishop Redwood, who was to become her lifelong supporter. In 1883, by invitation of the Maori of the Whanganui river area, Suzanne left Hawke's Bay for Hiruharama/Jerusalem, to revive the Catholic mission.

It is here that the home-grown Catholic congregation - the Daughters of Our Lady of Compassion - was born. In 1892 Archbishop Redwood appointed Suzanne as Mother Superior of the newly established Daughters of Our Lady of Compassion.

Mother Suzanne Aubert is a wonderful example of faith in action. She recognised the needs of the Maori people, disadvantaged children, the disabled, the homeless, young mothers, the poor, and the hungry, and she made it her lifelong mission to care for them.

Those needs that Mother Suzanne Aubert strenuously and tirelessly sought to help overcome are still here with us today. Hers' was a heart full of compassion, empathy, mercy, and love for all in need.

As Christians, we too are challenged to, like Mother Aubert, reach out to those who are less fortunate than ourselves, to support and care with the compassion and love of the one we follow, Jesus Christ.

So as we honour Mother Suzanne Aubert let us give thanks to God for her life of service to the people of Aotearoa/New Zealand, and pray through her intercession that we may have the courage and strength to follow in her footsteps, which are footsteps of Christ Our Lord.

"Try to learn – Me tohe ki te ako." Ven. Suzanne Aubert-Meri Hōhepa

Our Lady's Home of Compassion, Island Bay is a significant source of ambient learning about the life, works, spirituality and legacy of Compassion founder, Suzanne Aubert-Meri Hōhepa – not least because that is where she is buried. In fact, many places throughout central Wellington can quite legitimately make a claim on her influence. The Compassion Soup Kitchen, one of her most enduring works since its beginning in 1901, has operated from a few buildings, but always within about 100m of where it first began service. She was a well-known figure throughout the capital and every step she took had purpose. She understood that everyone had a part to play in support of others made vulnerable by the times.

Her funeral Mass took place at St Mary of the Angels church, a building she knew well, served by a Marist community with whom she had worked closely. By the time of her death in 1926, the church was a splendid replacement for the previous St Mary's which had burnt down in 1918 and been rebuilt by 1921. Hearing the news of St Mary's destruction would have touched her deeply. Apart from being a place of spiritual encounter for her personally, its doors were as open as her own to anyone who passed through the town.

Regrettably, Suzanne knew something of churches being burnt down and rebuilt. Three decades before, she was among those who witnessed the destruction by fire, assumed to be arson, of *Hato Hōhepa*-St Joseph's in *Hiruhārama*, Jerusalem. In those days, the construction followed by loss, the fundraising and subsequent rebuilding of *Hato Hōhepa* were events in which Suzanne was a central figure, encouraging others and doing what she could. Both the rebuilt *Hato Hōhepa* and St Mary of the Angels churches have endured and still welcome people today, over 100 years later.

Another St Joseph's, now part of St Mary of the Angels parish in Wellington, has strong Compassion connections too. This St Joseph's is a contemporary design which, when viewed from above, mimics a koru, the centre being the baptismal font unfolding first to the Blessed Sacrament chapel, then to spaces for gathering, sharing, hospitality and public worship. It is a building that claims by its very design, to be interested in people. How apt then, that some telling of Suzanne's story should be found here.


