24 September 2023, 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Here is a Gospel that evokes very mixed feelings in us who live in today's society. If we are honest with ourselves we must admit that the story of the workers who come in at the 11th hour strikes us as un-satisfactory. Here are wage earners who have hardly dirtied their hands, or worked hard in the heat of the day receiving a full day's pay. Where is the justice in that we ask! Those workers who were employed earlier, criticizing their employer for not showing more respect for the rules of social and distributive justice: that can't be right! And if this is what the kingdom of heaven is like, then we are talking about a world which lacks understanding and logic. We must remember that they agreed on one denarius a day!!

What makes it so much more serious is that Jesus tells this story to justify himself: he has to defend himself against spiteful tongues which reproach him for his preference for people of questionable morality and doubtful integrity. To this accusation, he has already replied that it is not those in good health that need the doctor, but those who are sick. To strengthen this argument still further, Jesus draws attention here to how God acts. Why be envious because I am generous'? There is the key to the argument. From time to time some Christians complain that the Church is no longer what it used to be; made up of good practicing Christians. Now she is running after the indifferent people with no standing in the world, no power and reputation! If only that were true! God's ways are not our ways.

The background of the parable is the culture of the time, for Jesus as well as Matthew. The workers of the first hour are the Jewish people, called by God to work in the vineyard. They bear the weight of the day, from Abraham to Moses. Now at the 11th hour Jesus calls the pagans, gentiles to work in his vineyard. 'Thus the first will be last and the last first.' That, the Jewish leaders did not like to accept.

God's action surpasses our calculations and our human way of acting. God surprises us and sometimes it is uncomfortable. Maybe God is asking us- to give more than what is just fair, not measuring it out, not trying to judge if it's enough or too little, or too much. True generosity from God is possible even in the midst of adversity.

We need to look at our lives and see the many small and big acts of generosity the Lord has given us and is giving to us. God urges us to give the best we can every moment of our lives.
