Understanding our Parish Priorities

As an insert in the Angelus this week is a summary of our Parish Priorities. This document has been developed by the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) to help focus our prayers, thoughts and planning, so that our activities support our mission as church.

Please note there are three mission themes: Sharing our Faith, Growing in Community and Working for Justice and Peace. These three themes are taken from the Archdiocesan Mission Statement. Under each theme is a summary of what we see as the scope of each area of mission. What needs to be developed next, is the detail of the activities which sit under each theme – a task that involves all our people, not just those members of the PPC. To get us to this point, we are grateful to PPC Member Neal Swindells who, with others, has led this piece of work.

Whilst this Parish Priorities summary gives us a useful way to think about decisions that we need to take, there are two significant issues in particular about which we wish to update the parish:

- On Sunday 12 November after the 9am Mass at St Joseph's, there
 will be a presentation on the Parish Properties that are adjacent to the
 Church. PPC member Nigel Prince will lead this discussion.
- On Sunday 19 November after the 9am Mass at St Mary's, there
 will be a presentation on our revenue and fundraising opportunities,
 and the recommendation about insurance cover. PPC member Wes
 Wernicki will lead this.

Please look through the Parish Priorities summary as this sets the context for our thinking. Please note also the presentation dates and topics. You are invited to offer comments in person at each event, or by email through the parish office or by talking with any of the PPC members.

PRIORITIES FOR OUR PARISH OF ST MARY OF THE ANGELS FOR THE NEXT FIFTY YEARS

We acknowledge our commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi and those who have passed on the Faith to us.

Objectives

To provide guidance for decisions that our Parish Pastoral Council, our priests and our parish committees will be making for the foreseeable future.



Catholic Archdiocese of Wellington Vision

"We the Catholic people of the Archdiocese of Wellington, challenged to follow Christ, are called to proclaim the Kingdom of God by celebrating God in our lives, sharing our living faith, growing in community, and working for justice and peace."



SHARING OUR LIVING FAITH

This would include:

- 1. Providing regular opportunities for the celebration of the sacraments, for a variety of forms of liturgy, for prayer and peaceful reflection.
- 2. Encouraging strong lay leadership, involving women, working to become more inclusive, educating and forming our people and building strong relationships with other Christians and other faiths.
- 3. Encouraging a spirituality of welcome, of hospitality and of manaakitanga to all
- 4. Promoting and developing St Mary of the Angels Church as the National Shrine of New Zealand; Te Ara a Maria: Mary's Way.
- 5. Making the care for creation an integral part of our activities.



GROWING IN COMMUNITY

This would include:

- 1. Building community and journeying together as a participatory church that recognises our bi-cultural partnership and our ethnic diversity.
- 2. Listening to and involving young people, including young families.
- 3. Enabling young people to live as disciples through involvement in spiritual, service and leadership activities.
- 4. Developing links to our Catholic secondary schools.
- 5. Improving our chaplaincy and support services to tertiary students in our city. Making our parish facilities a hub for Wellington's young adults.



WORKING FOR JUSTICE & PEACE

This would include:

- 1. Looking at how we can best support people within and outside our community.
- 2. Supporting both the formation of and continuation of parish groups who work to deepen our understanding of the causes of injustice, and to offer a practical hand up to the disadvantaged in our society.
- 3. Supporting connections with local and national organisations who work directly to support the vulnerable.
- 4. Supporting the international church including the mission outreach of the Society of Mary.

Careful stewardship should underpin all our priorities.

This will include:

- 1. Sensible management of our material resources and ensuring our Parish is financially viable.
- 2. Maintaining and enhancing our two beautiful churches where we and the wider Wellington community celebrate our Faith in Jesus Christ.



Caritas Jerusalem update

Between 8 to 23 October, 5,791 people have lost their ives in Gaza. A humanitarian crisis is looming. A Gaza Health Ministry spokesperson says that 7,000 patients and wounded in Gaza hospitals are at risk of death as fuel supplies, providing electricity, for kidney dialysis, intensive care support, and oxygen supply begin to run out. 12 aospitals and 32 Health centres are already out of service. Caritas Aotearoa New Zealand has called for a ceasefire and for sufficient humanitarian supplies to be allowed into Gaza to help vulnerable people caught up in the conflict. Let's go a step further and make sure this 'giving' puts the dignity and mana of our wider community whanau


