The whole history of salvation could be summed up: God created me because God wants me to be with him forever. God fell in love with me and wanted to share His glory with me. This I believe is God's purpose for His creation of me. A question can be asked: if He wants me to share His glory why did He not take me when I was born. He could have, and yet He had to give me time to make a decision, a fundamental decision. Do I want to be with Him in return? This is the issue that I have to contend with in the time He gives me on earth. My time on earth is temporary, but enough to prepare for this big decision.

To assist me in my preparation He gives me the capacity to enjoy the beauty and gifts of this world. The Church and Sacraments to remind, guide and embrace me with infinite love. The Church reminds me of God's restlessness while awaiting my decision.

Has my life been a reflection of a love returned? A love with all my heart, soul and mind? Have I reached the point of loving my neighbour as myself? God eagerly waits for my answer. For nothing can bring Him infinite delight except the love by one He loves most.

1st November we honour the feast of All Saints, those declared by the Church and all living in the presence of God. They too were sinners with a future with human frailty like us, they discovered an alternative route. The route paved with the Christian values enshrined in the Gospel. The way to real happiness, or a state of blessedness, is in being poor in spirit, being meek, hungry and thirsty for righteousness, being merciful, pure of heart and peace loving. Saints are, mothers and fathers, soldiers, kings and queens, the poor and rich, men and women who carried out their responsibilities in life according to Christian values and principals. They discovered Christ and His teachings. They saw a different light and allowed their lives to be guided by it.

2nd November All Souls Day is when we remember in prayer all the Souls in purgatory. On the 1st All saints Day we celebrate the Church Triumphant; on All Souls day the Church Suffering the souls in purgatory, the future saints. We the living, as Church Militant, unite to pray for all our beloved dead, all who have touched our lives. What better way can we do this but attend Mass here to pray for them, so they in turn will intercede for us when our time comes. May they rest in peace.



Mass of Remembrance


The Mass of Remembrance to celebrate all who have died this year and our relatives and friends who have passed on will be held on Saturday 4 November at 11am. All are welcome.
