

26 November 2023, Feast of Christ the King

Damaged Good are the Royal Emblem

The feast of Christ the King, though it's a feast of our whole catholic church, is a very special day for our Samoan catholic community at St Joseph's. We always celebrate this feast as an annual event with lots of entertainment, lots of fun, games, dancing, and finish with a great feast!

But there is a deeper meaning to this Feast that we must not overlook. We can uncover this meaning by reflecting on the following questions: Do we choose to avoid "the lower classes" because they ostensibly have no claim on us? Do we prefer to disassociate ourselves from the poor and suffering since the welfare system provides for them? Do we tend to muffle the cry of the poor because they apparently have no right to upset our peace? If we do, then in all such cases, we fail to uncover the image of Christ the King, the master of disguises. We don't realize that damaged goods are the royal emblem.

In the first of our scripture readings this Sunday from the prophet Ezekiel, God must intervene because the upper classes particularly have neglected the demands of the covenant. They have refused to become involved in the plight of fellow Israelites. As king and shepherd, Yahweh provides for the lost, those who have strayed, and the weak. As king and shepherd, He also condemns the leaders of His people for not recognizing Him in the needs of His sheep. For Ezekiel, damaged goods are the royal emblem.

In the Gospel reading from Matthew, those on the left have disparaged the image of our king. Jesus, the king and shepherd, is equated with the outcasts and the neglected of society. To alleviate the suffering of such people is to uncover the image of Jesus. To refuse concern is to refuse allegiance to our king and shepherd. Jesus is reflected in all who stand in need of help of whatever kind. For Matthew too, like Ezekiel, damaged goods are the royal emblem.

Leaders who react to the injustices suffered at the hands of oppressive governments recognize the presence of the king. Those who work patiently and reverently with the handicapped acknowledge the subjects of the king. Those who meet the needs of the elderly and the dying witness to the image of the king. Those who fight prejudice of whatever form revere the insignia of the king. These and all those who strip away the façade to discover the sisters and brothers of Jesus affirm that damaged goods are the royal emblem.

The Eucharist is the presence of Christ the King amongst us. The Eucharist proclaims the presence of Christ the King in the forms of bread and wine. The Eucharist challenges our community to make real and active our faith in Christ the King through their service of others. The Eucharist insists that the presence of Christ the King is to be uncovered or discovered in others. The Eucharist testifies that damaged goods are the royal emblem.
