#### 3 December 2023, 1st Sunday of Advent—Year B

#### The Season of Advent

The days are getting longer, school and university exams are over, holidays are about to start. Party-goers are walking the streets, a different kind of music and song is heard more frequently, decorations are appearing in shops, offices and even petrol stations, the art of gift-wrapping is being practiced everywhere. It is obvious that something is about to happen, something that is bringing an air of joy into everyone's life.

The atmosphere around the city is quietly changing. And the atmosphere in St Mary of the Angels and St Joseph's is changing also. It begins with a change in colour. For many months green has been the colour of the vestments, the tabernacle veil and the hanging on the lectern. Now, on the first Sunday of Advent, the colour changes to purple. We Catholics use purple to remind ourselves to be watchful, to repent, to do penance. Many of us might remember this song still heard occasionally during this time of year:

"You better watch out, You better not cry, You better not pout, I'm telling you why, Santa Claus is coming to town!"

Yes, someone is coming to town. But someone far more important than Santa Claus! The infant Jesus, the Son of God, is soon to be born! The words of the prophet Isaiah express what the colour purple signifies, "Prepare the way of the Lord!"

This change in atmosphere is further accentuated by the blessing, through prayer and holy water, of the Advent wreath and the Jesse Tree in the sanctuary.

The Advent wreath is made of evergreen branches and four candles. The vibrant green colour of the branches remind us of the hope for renewed life we believe the birth of Jesus promises us. The circular shape signifies that this renewed life will be for eternity. The first of the four candles is lit on the first Sunday until all four are lit on the last Sunday - the light grows every Sunday increasingly pushing out the

The Jesse Tree is named after the father of King David. Symbols are gradually added to the tree representing persons who reflect the patient longing of the Chosen People of Israel for the coming of their Saviour. The persons represented are ancestors of Jesus, either in faith or in bloodline, such as Adam, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Jesse, David, Solomon, Joseph and Mary.

So, the season of Advent, through sign and symbol, blends together a penitential spirit much like Lent, a joyful spirit as we await the birth of Jesus and a spirit of preparation - preparing for the second and final coming of Jesus as Lord.

The Advent season teaches us to wait for God who will come to us in unexpected ways.



#### The Jesse Tree

During Advent we reflect on how God was revealed to people in Old Testament times before the coming of Jesus. Matthew's Gospel (1:1-17) links the Old and New Testaments. He sets out the genealogy or whakapapa of Jesus' earthly family through which history, knowledge, philosophies and spiritualities were handed down until the birth of Jesus.

The Jesse tree is a visual reminder of this. The name comes from Isaiah's prophecy (Isaiah 11:1) that the Messiah or Saviour would come from among Jesse's descendants.

The symbols on the tree are based on centuries of Christian tradition. The symbols vary between Church and the St Mary of the Angels Church symbols are explained further in the Parish App under 'Links'. We will add 4 symbols each week of Advent beginning with the Creation (Earth), Adam and Eve (tree), Noah's Ark, and Abraham and Sarah (stars).
