

## 28 January 2024, 4th Sunday of Ordinary Time—Year B

Getting back into the swing of things after a break is always a bit of a jolt to the senses and this year is no different. Christmas seems ages ago and all the preparation for gift-giving and spending time with family and friends, is now spoken of as "last year". Added to this, the realisation that Ash Wednesday is just over a fortnight away on 14 February is a little intimidating. Happily, we are not "journeying" through 2024 on our own and we can expect joys as well as challenges in the year ahead.

One of the gifts of last year from the perspective of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is the way the parish has made progress on some persistent issues. The work of the sub-committee that is looking at the properties around St Joseph's will continue throughout this year. This is important work and there are no easy answers in finding the way forward for us. As speculation about the effects of a second Mt Victoria tunnel becomes clearer, so too will the options for those properties. This work remains "top of mind" for 2024.

At the St Mary's end of the parish, the question about insurance options has been thoroughly interrogated and there is a recommendation to bring our insurance commitment into line with what is currently in place for St Joseph's. This still leaves the parish with a significant financial commitment to cover insurance for all our buildings, but it means we can now focus on the revenuegenerating activities we need to undertake as a whole parish to support our mission. Generating income is the responsibility for the whole parish, so it is encouraging that there is plenty of scope for our people to be involved. The Revenue subcommittee has explored several options to improve our revenue and, as a matter of some urgency, this work will be a priority this year.

The Waitangi Day mass this year provides an opportunity for everyone, parishioners and visitors, to appreciate the work of our National Shrine subcommittee, which has worked with the Catholic Bishops' Conference to install the Te Ara a Maria artwork. Waitangi Day is a significant date for our nation and this image, which has elements of the Catholic history of Aotearoa New Zealand, is a reminder that we are not the first, nor will we be the last, to follow this path in faith. What the image shows us too, is that wherever our starting point, we are making the journey together.
