#### 28 April 2024, 5th Sunday of Easter

I am not a gardener, it has never appealed to me. I enjoy what I see others put into it and what it produces. In saying all this today's Gospel is one of my favourites The Vine and the Branches.

Sometimes people have the idea in their head of a wrathful God who punishes anyone who doesn't do what He says. They say, "You know what? My life is easier without all that, "But that isn't the God revealed by Christ. As Jesus says, 'He didn't come to make things difficult for us, he came that we may have life".

Jesus says, His Father is the vine grower. God is the source of life. Jesus is the vine. He is the life. The branches that grow off the vine- that's us. We have life as long as we stay connected to the vine. What happens if we are cut off? We wither and die. What happens when we cut ourselves off from the source of life. Jesus says these withered branches will be gathered and burnt. What matters if the branches get burnt? They are dead anyway. The part we need to avoid is being cut off from the Vine our source of life.

As the branch abiding in the vine bears fruit, when we abide in Jesus our lives become fruitful. Just as the vine is the life source of the branches. Jesus is our life source. We must learn to depend on Him and draw from Him our energy and strength. If we cut ourselves off from Jesus we are like the branches of the vine that wither and die. The branch of the vine is suitable for one or two things: either the vine or the fire (St. Augustine)

God the Father the Vinedresser, prunes the vine. Pruning is painful but productive. Useless branches drain the vine; they are better severed and thrown away. Fruit bearing branches are pruned so that they may bear even more fruit.

To believe in Jesus means taking seriously the things he says and does., repenting from our sins, taking advantage of the sacraments He gave us, and participating in the life of the Church He established. The foundation- the glue, if you will, that keeps attached to the vine- is Love. Love God, love each other, love ourselves. Without love we wither away: if we hate God, we start to hate each other, and eventually we come to hate ourselves. Then we are like this dead branch that's really only good for burning.

Jesus wants to spare us that, which is why He invites us today to remain in His love, that we might live and bear good fruit: Joy Love, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self Control.(Gal.5:22)
