

29 September 2024, 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

When we harbour and nurture an "us-and-them" mentality we tend to demonise or regard with distain those whom we consider to be outsiders: the "them" grouping as distinct from "us". We become blind to the work of God's Spirit outside our circle of accepted associates or, worse, we come to believe God can only act for members within our own group. In both cases, are we not in danger of dictating where, when and with whom God can work; our way of taming God? Well, in our gospel reading this Sunday Jesus begs to differ. For Jesus, anyone who does what is good is acting for and not against God. Indeed, such a person enjoys God's favour since all that is good has its source in God's great Sabbath of creation.

Besides, Jesus' name means one who saves. He himself has said, "I came not to condemn the world but to save it" (cf. John 3:17). He came to save the world. He did not come just to save those who will profess explicit faith in him. Need we be reminded that nothing which is genuinely human should fail to find an echo in our hearts? After all, anything that is genuinely human is the soil in which God intends to sow the message of salvation (cf. *Pastoral Constitution of the Church in the Modern Word*, Vatican II, #1).

So wherever and whenever we see people doing what is life-giving we ought to see the presence of God's Spirit at work. If nothing else, to recognise the presence of the Spirit at work in the world wherever and whenever we see what is good being done can act as a deterrent against creating the real possibility of scandal in which we are shown to be the kind of people who do not practise what we preach, namely, people who preach the love of God and neighbour but who are selective as to whom we consider to be our neighbour!

Our gospel reading today warns us against creating any scandal that brings into disrepute the example given to us by the Lord. It is better that we cut off and throw away what is spiritually harmful in us rather than retain what is harming, only for us to later bare our souls to the deeply penetrating scrutiny of God's judgement; a judgement that is exacting but always just.


