

Day of Celebration for Venerable Suzanne Aubert

What will it mean for us, when Suzanne Aubert-Meri Höhepa is declared Aotearoa New Zealand's first saint? She is, as they so prosaically say in Vatican circles, "On the train." What they mean is, her life, works and spirituality have been examined - already at some considerable length - and she has been found worthy of being recognised as "Venerable". There are further spiritual inquiries that must be satisfied before she can be declared "Blessed" and then "Saint". It's a train on a long journey.

So what indeed, will it mean when her "heroic virtues" finally reveal she is worthy to be entered in the canon of Saints, recognised throughout the world now and for eternity? Certainly, there is likely to be curiosity about how her arrival to Aotearoa in 1860 as a young woman, part of Bishop Pompallier's Auckland Mission to urban Maori, ended up six decades later with the "largest funeral ever accorded a woman" at St Mary of the Angels Church in Wellington. She had throughout her life, travelled greatly and done much. She was recognised in her own time for the establishment of Homes and Institutions to support those made vulnerable by the times, the founding of the Sisters of Compassion and setting in motion the guidance for their work. Some works would last a century or more - the Soup Kitchen for example – some would be set aside as other social supports became the norm. Yet none of her hard work and practical deeds are the central concern of the Causes for Saints. What sets her apart is that her life and works, imperfect as they may be, remain today a channel for the Holy Spirit to act in the world.

It's a gift that we can know her and a great privilege that we can claim her friendship and intercession. She lived, technically within living memory. There are plenty today who knew or are related to those who knew her first-hand. It would be good to speak to them. They are likely to hold a range of recollections, depending on their situation; the traditional medicines and remedies that became a commercial success, the skilled "field-nursing" for which she was known, her ease and scholarship in Te Reo, her preference for practical works and community, her building of churches, her simple acceptance that God is in every place and among all people. Her time in Auckland was dogged by difficulty, as it is for many today. Her time in Hawke's Bay among an aging Marist Mission was the stuff of respite and renewal and her time in Hiruharama-

Jerusalem, Wellington, Rome and places throughout New Zealand leave a trail of hope and encouragement.

When she is declared a saint, it could be in recognition of any number of virtues. It is possible that just one will emerge, her ability to look for and find, Christ in every person. In this, she is still at work in Aotearoa, with us, today.


